3. Dallas Police Department - Response to Resistance Reporting – Use of Force

Presenter: Sergeant Kris Kelly, Dallas Police Department

- The Dallas Police Department uses a Linear Response-to-Resistance Continuum as its training model
- It simultaneously recognizes the level of subject resistance encountered and the level of control required for the situation
- It **does not** direct a particular officer on how much control to use in a particular situation
- It gives direction in the escalation and de-escalation of resistance and the escalation and de-escalation of control necessary in police incidents
- It explains that many variables are involved in situations where an officer must control a subject.
- In all cases, the Dallas Police Department dictates that only reasonably necessary control techniques are justified. Any use of control techniques above that would be unjustified and the goal of control violated
- If no apparent need to take a suspect into immediate physical custody, officers should utilize tactics designed to de-escalate and facilitate a safer resolution
- The use of delaying tactics and additional officer presence is encouraged, as long as the safety is not compromised

4. Dallas Police Department - Body Worn Camera Program

Presenter: Sergeant Stephen Williams, Dallas Police Department

The Department has adopted the use of Body Worn Cameras (BWC) to enhance our citizen interactions and provide additional investigatory evidence. The department recognizes that BWC images have a limited field of view and cannot always show the full story, nor do video images capture an entire scene. The use of body worn cameras does not reduce the requirement to provide thorough written documentation of an incident.


