## **Dallas Public Library announces winner of Teen Center Logo Contest**

**Dallas** – Tiffaney Stanley, a 17-year old senior at Lincoln High School is the winner of the Dallas Public Library's Teen Center logo contest.

"My logo encourages teens to burst out of their shells and to express and enhance their knowledge to others," Stanley said. The teen will receive a \$50 gift certificate for the winning logo and her teacher will receive a \$100 donation for the purchase of books for the school.

The Dallas Public Library will open 20 new Teen Centers at branch libraries across Dallas on June 16.

Teen Centers provide exposure to positive role models in the community and offer special programs on career planning, college admission, and homework help via the Internet. Teen Center activities include interview training, job fairs, computer training, help with college and scholarship applications, creative writing, public speaking, Web design and arts and crafts. Library staff as well as academic and professional community residents guide and advise teens throughout these activities.
