FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDED SEPTEMBER 30, 2022**

The City of Dallas will submit its annual Action Plan for FY 2021-22 on August 13, 2021 to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). The City's public notice for this Action Plan includes the various locations of services offered to low- and -moderate income families in the City of Dallas.

On June 9, 2021, the Dallas City Council is scheduled to authorize final adoption of the FY 2021-22 HUD Consolidated Plan Budget for U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development Grant Funds in the revised estimated amount of \$31,218,434 for the following programs and estimated amounts: (a) Community Development Block Grant in the revised amount of \$15,086,728; (b) HOME Investment Partnerships Program in the amount of \$5,897,968; (c) Emergency Solutions Grant in the amount of \$1,290,230; (d) Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS in the amount of \$7,943,508; and (e) estimated Program Income in the amount of \$1,000,000. In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, HUD issued a waiver that allows grantees to hold virtual meetings using an on-line platform in lieu of holding in-person public hearings to fulfill the public hearing requirements under HUD regulations and the City's Citizen Participation Plan. The waiver applies so long as national or local public health authorities recommend social distancing limiting public gatherings for public health reasons to limit the spread of COVID-19, which continues to be the case.

A virtual public hearing will be held on May 26, 2021. The purpose of the virtual public hearing is to receive comments on the City's Proposed FY 2021-22 HUD Consolidated Plan Budget. This budget will be made available for public review and comment from April 29, 2021 through June 8, 2021. Final adoption is scheduled for June 9, 2021.
