In order to reach the mandated population equality for redistricting of Council District 12, we have proposed a partial plan which would move 8237 from District 12 into District 11 (the only district adjoining where population can be flowed). That number deviates from that allowed by less than 10%.

The area bounded by Arapaho/Coit/Hillcrest and Beltline contains 3444 population and would be incorporated into District 11. It is currently is bounded on the western and southern sides by District 11 and on the east by the city of Richardson. The homeowner group of that area would be kept intact.

Two common district community-of-interests are the Preston Ridge Trail and the Cottonbelt, so efforts to keep those homeowner groups and constituencies are attempted in reaching the required number to be shifted into District 11. The southernmost area of the trail (from Beltline to Arapaho) is being shifted with the above-change, so we want to leave the "core" of the district above Arapaho (homeowner groups which share activities, school, the Trail) intact.

Therefore, on the western boundary of the District, we propose shifting the boundary of the present District 11 to move northward and include the area from Keller Springs on the south, Tollway on the west, Preston on the east, Dallas/Collin county line on the north. Additionally, an area from the Collin County line on south, Tollway on the west, Frankford on the north, and White Rock Creek on the east would in included. This block would have 4803 population. That, with the 3444 from the previously pegged area would reach 8247, within 10% of the mandated deviation. This would cause no appreciable change in ethnic composition. This addition encompasses golf course area communities, would not split neighborhoods and keep the district core and common areas of interest in tact. Additionally, it follows geographic boundaries or major traffic arterials and contains all contiguous territory. Since much of the area contains golf courses with much open space (and would be a continuation north of the "Bent Tree" area), there is going to be less "compactness" than if it were all developed as residential. But in all other aspects (common social, cultural, community, and economic interests), we feel this proposal has the least negative consequences for the district.

(Please note that our numbers may be off a slight amount, but should be very close!)
