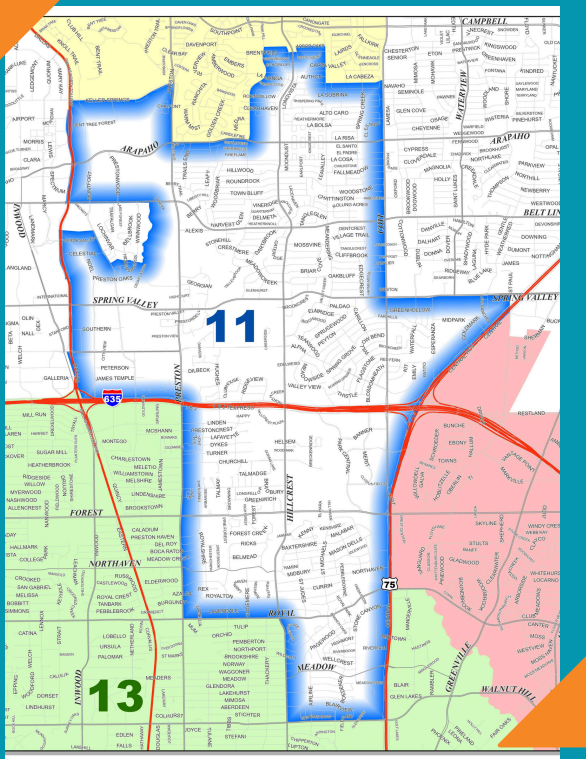

W. Hillcrest High School

The only DISD high school in District 11, Hillcrest High School also has an IB Program. Home of the panthers, the school is located at Hillcrest and Aberdeen.

X. Churchill Recreation Center

Located at Hillcrest and Churchill Way, Churchill Recreation Center hosts fitness facilities and community programs.

Y. Medical City Dallas

Located at Forest and 75, Medical City has nearly 3000 employees. Medical City has delivered over 4000 babies.

Z. Boedeker Sidewalk Challenge

Boedeker Street Water and Wastewater Main Improvements Installation of approximately 14,800 feet of water and wastewater mains on Boedeker Street from Royal Lane to Walnut Hill. Construction started June 2023.

A: Goldmark Cultural Center

In 2017, this building was converted into studio art space, and now hosts workshops and events. Artists work and display art for the public to see and purchase.

B. Esperanza

The Esperanza Area encompasses 635 to Spring Valley and 75 to Coit. The area is predominantly Spanish speaking. The Esperanza Economic Vitality Task force works to improve the neighborhood's quality of life.

C. Pepper Square

Pepper Square sits at Beltline and Preston. Recent plans have been made to potentially add more retail, residential, green spaces, and trail extensions.

D. Prism Center

The Prism Center was purchased by the City of Dallas. The building hosts the District 11 Community Office and international trade offices.

E. Holy Trinity Greek Orthodox Church

The church was founded in 1915 by immigrants from Orthodox countries, mostly Greece. After relocating twice, the church is now at Hillcrest and Alpha.

F. Jewish Community Center

Located on Northhaven Road between St. Michaels and 75, the JCC has camps, preschools, fitness and wellness facilities, and youth/teen/senior programs.

G. Mt. Pisgah Baptist Church Historical Marker

Mt. Pisgah has seen three locations. The historical marker sits at the original location, which was donated by former slave William Wilkerson in 1886.

H. White Rock Cemetery

Founded in 1889, White Rock Cemetery, markers mostly belong to those of formerly enslaved people and early Black Dallas families.

I. Workforce Solutions of Greater Dallas

WFSDallas's mission centers on providing competitive solutions for employers through quality people and for people through quality jobs.

J. Hillcrest Village

Hillcrest Village is a Net Zero Energy emergency shelter and supportive housing development where 100% of utilities are supplied by solar energy.

K. Dallas County North Dallas Government Center

Located and Hillcrest and 635, the government center hosts a tax office, passport services, truancy services, veteran services and juvenile services.

L. Anderson Bonner Park

Anderson Bonner Park was established in 1976, on 44 acres of the land Bonner owned. In 2022, the City of Dallas dedicated a sculpture for Bonner at the park.

M. Northaven Trail Bridge

The 201-foot span bridge weighs more than 800,000 pounds and was built across 75 over 20 hours one weekend.

N. Fretz Recreation Center, Park, & Library

Located on Beltline Road, Fretz hosts D11 community events, preschool programs, senior programs, and more.

O. Galleria Mall

The Galleria has more than 200 retailers, restaurants and experiences. The Galleria's Christmas tree is the country's tallest indoor Christmas tree.

P. Anne Frank Elementary

As the largest elementary school in Dallas, the DISD school serves students from as many as 58 countries who speak more than 24 languages.

R. RISD Academy

Located on Coit Road, RISD Academy is a K-6th Elementary School. RISD Academy has an enrollment of over 700 students.

S. Future Esperanza Community Center

The Esperanza community center will provide residents with access to resources for utilizing city services.

T. Northwood Hills Elementary

Home of the Falcons, Northwood Hills Elementary is located on Meandering Way. The RISD School is a K-6th elementary school.

U. Arthur Kramer Elementary

Kramer opened its doors over 50 years ago. Home of the Colts, the DISD school is located at Midbury Drive.

V. Benjamin Franklin International Exploratory Academy

Located on Meadow, Franklin middle school has a International Baccalaureate (IB) Middle Years Programme (MYP).
