Protest Update

I'm happy to say that for the past two days protests have been peaceful, and no arrests have been made. I do not have any information yet as to when curfew will end and will be sure to share with you as I learn more. We have received several calls and emails on both sides of the aisle regarding the protests. I would like to take a moment to remind everyone that we live in a wonderful country where people have a constitutional right to peacefully protest. Chief Hall has made it very clear that she believes in and will honor this right, however, if people break the law they will be arrested.

Our office has heard about the potential for protests all over the City. DPD is in constant communication with my office regarding any protests that could occur in our district. DPD has assured my office that they are monitoring the situation and will have a plan in place to be present for peaceful protests and to deescalate as needed.

This includes the residence of those arrested among other information. Please note that for the purpose of DPD reporting, people who identify as Hispanic are included in the white category. COVID-19 Update

In the background of the protests, the pandemic continues. Our hospitalization rates and ICU bed availability have remained stable, however, we did still see a high number of new cases reported yesterday. Please see the information below. I encourage you to continue to work from home if you are able, social distance appropriately, sanitize and wash your hands frequently and wear a mask when in public to protect yourself and those you come in contact with.

As of 11:00am June 3, 2020, Dallas County Health and Human Services is reporting 239 additional positive cases of 2019 novel coronavirus (COVID-19), bringing the total case count in Dallas County to 10,958, including 249 deaths.

The additional 4 deaths are being reported today include:

-A man in his 40's who was a resident of the City of Lancaster and had been critically ill in an area hospital. He had underlying high risk health conditions.

-A man in his 50's who was a resident of the City of Dallas and had been critically ill in an area hospital. He had underlying high risk health conditions.

-A woman in her 50's who was a resident of the City of Dallas and had been critically ill in an area hospital. She did not have underlying high risk health conditions.

-A woman in her 100's who was a resident of the City of Dallas and had been hospitalized. She had underlying high risk health conditions.
