Purpose



Provide an overview of the FY25 plan for the newly launched **Clean Sweep! Program**, which represents a consolidated and collaborative approach to keeping Dallas city streets and public right-ofway clean.



Goals and Objectives



The FY25 **Clean Sweep! Program** is a holistic approach to the cleanup of public rights-of-way (ROW) through more frequent mowing, litter removal, encampment cleaning and preventive measures to discourage the unsheltered in public ROW areas.

Jon Taylor-Brown Deputy Program Lead

Oversees daily operations of the Clean Sweep! Program. Provides program and budget oversight, along with regular performance reporting.

Marshal's Office

Provides enforcement support and traffic control for OHS at encampments during outreach and/or cleanings.

Data Analytics & Business Intelligence

Supports dashboard creation, heat maps and other ways to accurately track data for Clean Sweep! program execution.

Office of Homeless Solutions

Collaborates with TPW on to schedule encampment cleanups and install fencing on public ROW as a preventative measure. Also provides homeless outreach services to the unsheltered population.

Environmental Cleanup Fee



- Effective October 1, 2024, a new Environmental Cleanup fee of \$3.00 per month is assessed to each utility account to support environmental initiatives.
- The projected FY 2025 revenue from the environmental fee is \$10.5 million.



TPW Clean Sweep! In-House Team

- 17 positions in TPW Clean Sweep! Team
- Crews operate seven (7) days a week, 7am to 7pm
- Litter removal on public right of way
- Homeless Encampment debris
 removal







Clean Sweep! Contractor Strategy

- Litter Removal: Increase number of contracted litter cycles and new processes for in-house litter removal on City and external partners' ROW.
 - Added 9 litter cycles on City ROW
 - Added 4 litter cycles on Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) ROW
- **Mowing:** Add 2 contracted mow cycles on TxDOT ROW.
- Install Fencing: Reduce number of unsheltered sites along public ROW. Collaborate with the Office of Homeless Solutions (OHS) to identify locations.


Data Map - Response to 311 Service Requests

Clean Sweep! Team has responded to 713 service requests from October 1, – November 14, 2024






Collaborate with External Partners On Main Lanes




Reporting Litter or Mowing Concerns
