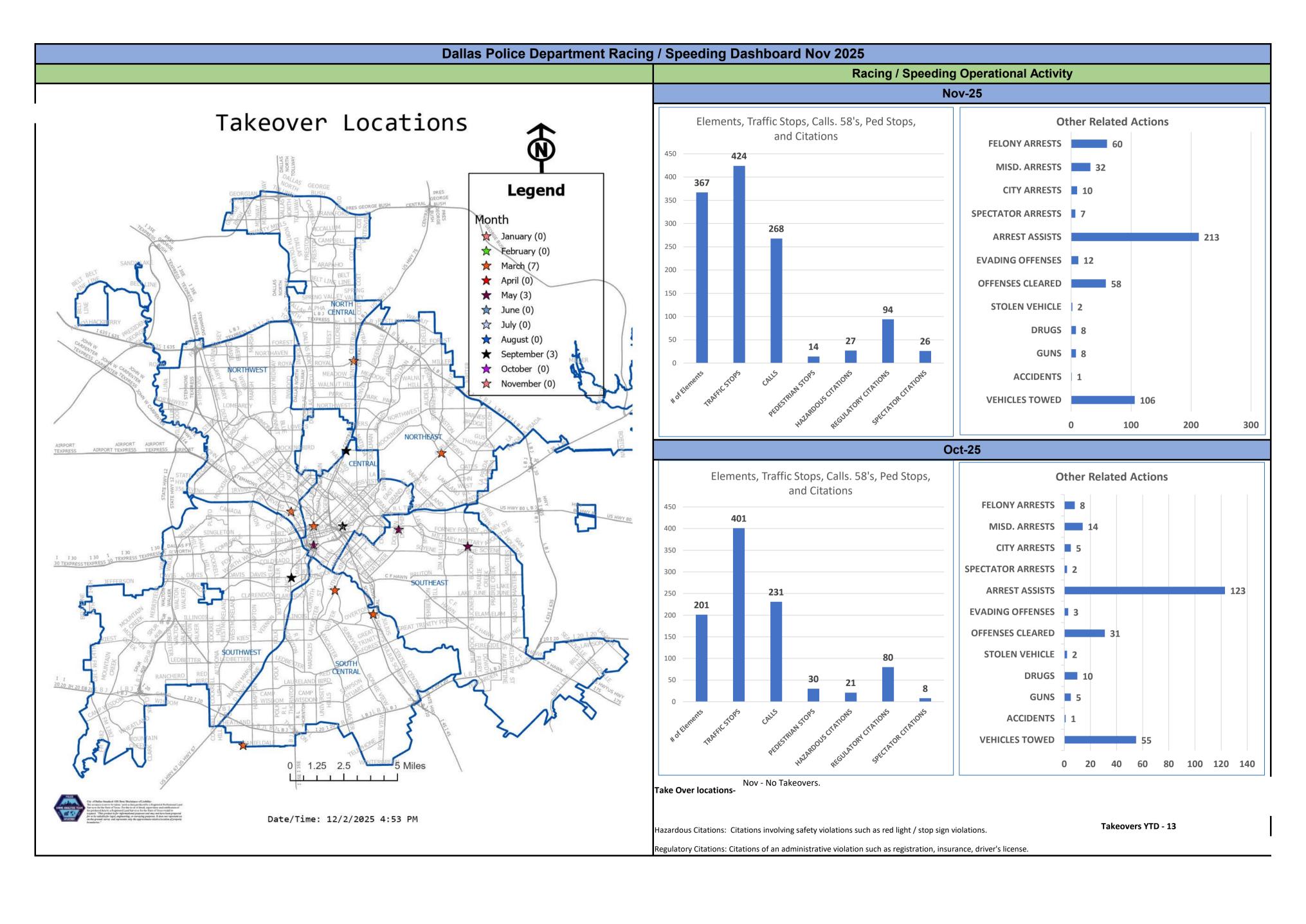

SUBJECT Dallas Fire-Rescue's Public Safety Dashboard - November 2025

Dallas Fire-Rescue (DFR) had 18,083 dispatched incidents for November, a decrease from the 24,541 in October. As you are aware, DFR has a stated goal of achieving 90% of the metrics for EMS response within 9 minutes and Structure Fire Response within 5:20. However, DFR did not reach this goal for EMS (87%) and Fire response (86%).

We had three significant fires in November, down from the six we had in October. Inspection activity decreased from September (3,923 to 2,017). Our rescue unit hours of utilization (UHU) numbers decreased to 34.6% for Frontline units.

We currently have 180 recruits in various stages of training who are scheduled to be assigned to the field between November 2025 and June 2026. For your quick reference, you can access DFR's Dashboard using the following link:

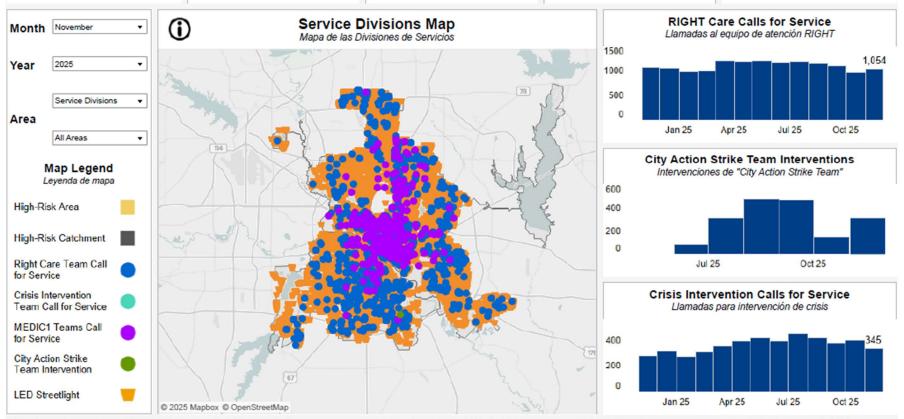

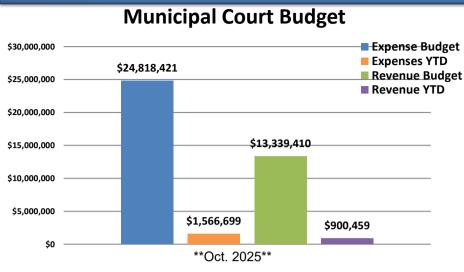

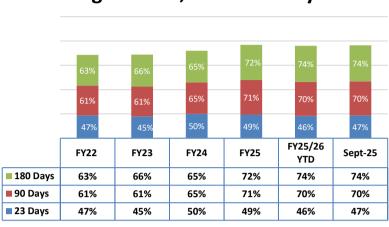

Dallas Municipal Court and Dallas Marshals Office: Month Ending November 2025

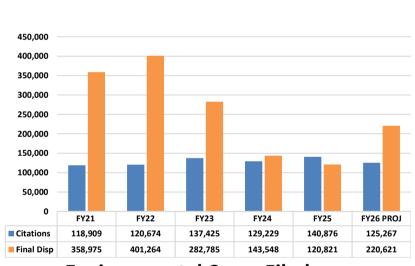


Defendant's Cumulative Response Rate Looking Back 23, 90 & 180 Days

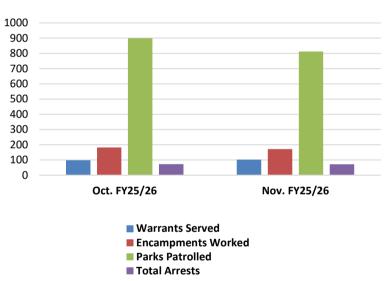




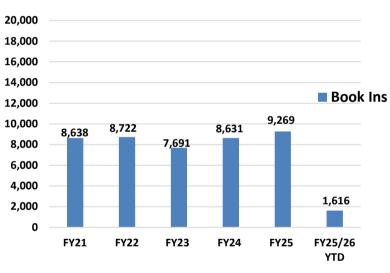
Citation Count & Final Dispositions



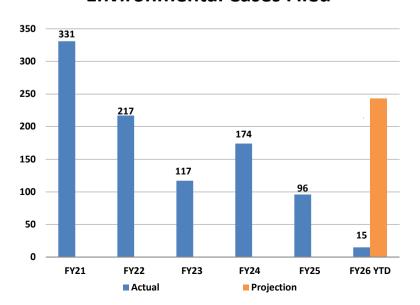
Marshal's Enforcement Activity



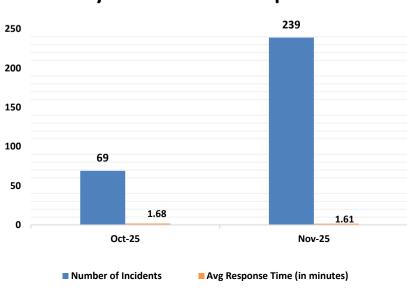
City Detention Center Book-Ins



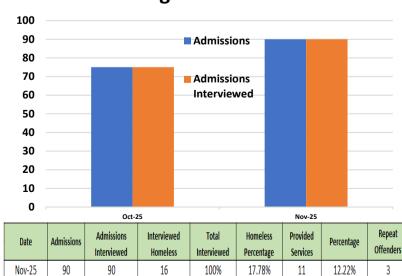
Environmental Cases Filed
