### **Dallas Fire-Rescue's Department Public Safety Dashboard – October 2025**

Dallas Fire-Rescue (DFR) had 24,541 dispatched incidents for October, an increase from 23,470 in September. As you are aware, DFR has a stated goal of achieving 90% of the metrics for EMS response within 9 minutes and Structure Fire Response within 5:20. However, DFR did not reach this goal for EMS (87%) and Fire response (89%).

We had six significant fires in October, up from the three we had in September. Inspection activity decreased from September (3,962 to 3,652). Our rescue unit hours of utilization (UHU) decreased to 35.3% for Frontline units.

We currently have 180 recruits in various stages of training who are scheduled to be assigned to the field between November 2025 and June 2026. 






# Defendant's Cumulative Response Rate Looking Back 23, 90 & 180 Days







# **Citation Count & Final Dispositions**








