SUBJECT Development Services Department Continues to experience IT Connectivity issues

Development Services Department (DSD) continues to experience ITS connectivity issues. DSD staff is sending notifications to customers via the Department's website and social media and is actively working with the ITS Team for a resolution.

In addition, the May 2023 Ransomware Attack impacted and limited staff's ability to access internal shared drives and GIS Zoning maps which are fundamental tools in the plan review process. These limitations caused major delays in the issuance of permits. The total number of permit applications for single-trade permits (re-roofs, fence permits, foundation repairs, demolition) in the queue is 870. The team is strategically implementing overtime and weekend schedules to reduce these permit types in the current queue.

The GIS Zoning maps were restored on June 7, 2023, in a limited capacity, and on June 27, 2023, in a more ample capacity. The team is progressively working to meet pre-Ransomware permitting performance goals.

SUBJECT Fiscal Year 2022 Audit Reports

We are pleased to report that we have now concluded all external audits for 2022. The City of Dallas received unmodified or clean opinions for all of the 2022 external audits.

- We previously published the <u>City of Dallas' Annual Comprehensive Financial</u> <u>Report (ACFR)</u>, which we completed on February 24, 2023. This report is a summary of the financial activities of the City for the past fiscal year. We also published the annual audit reports for the <u>Airport Revenues Fund</u>, <u>Schedule of</u> <u>Passenger Facility Charges Collected and Expended</u>, <u>Dallas Water Utilities</u>, and <u>Downtown Dallas Development Authority</u>.
- On June 20, 2023, we received the City of Dallas' <u>Federal Single Audit</u> and <u>State</u> <u>Single Audit</u> reports for fiscal year 2022. The Federal and State Single Audits are annual reports checking for compliance with how the City administers its Federal and State financial assistance as required by the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) and State of Texas Uniform Grant Management Standards.
- On June 27, 2023, we received the audit opinion for the annual financial statements of the <u>Dallas Convention Center Hotel Development Corporation</u> (<u>DCCHDC</u>) for the year ended December 31, 2022.

Thank you for your support of excellent financial management and reporting. We look forward to working with you to further strengthen the City's financial policies and operations.

SUBJECT Mayor and City Council Office Reconfiguration Update

The Ad Hoc Committee on Administrative Affairs requested that staff explore the possibility of utilizing a zero-based planning approach to reconfigure the Mayor and City Council Offices. After careful consideration, the Building Services Department (BSD) has determined that contracting with a space planning consultant would be the most suitable course of action for redesigning the offices.

In collaboration with BSD, the Mayor and City Council (MCC) will initiate the process of procuring a space planning consultant through an administrative action. The primary objective for engaging the consultant will be to thoroughly assess the entire MCC office space and provide the Council with comprehensive cost estimates. These estimates should encompass various elements, such as design, demolition, construction, furniture, data ports, electrical systems, flooring, fire alarms, administrative costs, contingency, and any other relevant expenses.

However, it is important to note that we do not anticipate having the finalized cost estimates ready for presentation during the FY 2023-2024 budget briefings. Consequently, we may not have funds readily available for the upcoming fiscal year's budget. Nevertheless, we remain open to receiving further guidance and direction in this matter.

Office of Homeless Solutions Updates

R.E.A.L. Time Rehousing

The Dallas Real Time Rapid Rehousing (D.R.T.R.R.) team of homeless service providers, co-led by the Office of Homeless Solutions (OHS) and Housing Forward is on track to

house over 2,700 unique individuals by 2023. The City and its partners now have a new goal of housing 6,000 unique individuals by 2025 and have rebranded the initiative to reflect the rehousing of those individuals across the expanse of the metroplex to R.E.A.L. Time Rehousing (RTR).

OHS Street Outreach Update

Outreach is currently targeting several encampments, which will result in closure through the housing of those unsheltered individuals throughout the year. The team will outreach to these sites and meet with various persons experiencing homelessness to assess their needs in preparation for site closure via housing. During this time, the OHS Street Outreach Team will continue to engage with unsheltered residents through normal street outreach, connecting people with the needed resources, such as: getting IDs, working with Community Courts on expunging eligible tickets and offenses from their records, identifying medical needs, and getting them access to the Coordinated Access System (CAS). The RTR Community Dashboard is live and may be found here.

Please see the attached schedule for homeless encampment cleaning the week of June 26 through June 30, 2023. Please note that these will be for debris removal and outreach only. All encampment cleaning requests are being resolved as time and weather allows and are subject to modification in response to special requests by City leadership.

Give Responsibly Campaign Outreach Update

The Office of Homeless Solutions and Code Compliance work together to promote the Give Responsibly Campaign (GRC). This initiative aims to prevent street charity and illegal solicitation in the community through education and engagement. While providing alternative solutions for our residents experiencing homelessness.

The Office of Homeless Solutions Community Liaison and Code Compliance Neighborhood Code Representatives are partnering to visit businesses in hot spots across all districts, which started May 16, 2023. So far, OHS has visited businesses in Districts 2 and 8 with plans to visit Districts 3,4,6,11, and 12 scheduled for June, July, and August. This joint effort aims to address issues related to homelessness and the adverse effects street charity and illegal solicitation have on the community. It will provide education on sustainably supporting those in need while ensuring a safer and more comfortable environment for businesses and their patrons. H.A.R.T/eam Update

The Homeless Action Response Team (H.A.R.T/eam) is led by the Office of Homeless Solutions (OHS) and encompasses four teams comprised of a core team of the following: Crisis Intervention Team (CIT), Dallas Animal Services (DAS), Dallas Marshals, and Code Compliance (Code). This team is supplemented by Parks and Recreation, Dallas Fire & Rescue, and Public Works as needed. The purpose of H.A.R.T/eam. is to provide a quick

response to immediate safety concerns around homeless encampments and hot spots. The teams are assigned and respond to time-sensitive, critical issues received via 311 and via email which are defined as:

- Issues raised by City Leadership and members of City Council requests
- Issues presenting an immediate safety concern (the presence of firearms, uncontrolled fires, reports of threatening behavior)
- Any issues which would derail the normal street outreach service resolution process
- Panhandling
