SUBJECT FY 2024-25 Adopted Budget

Thank you for your participation and commitment to the City's budget development and approval process. On Wednesday, September 18, the City Council completed all steps required to adopt the FY 2024-25 operating, capital, and grants/trusts budgets. After receiving the Interim City Manager's recommended budget on August 13, the City Council approved 7 amendments (attached) that were incorporated into the budget prior to final adoption. We will update both the on-line and printed budget documents to reflect the adopted budget and make those available in November.

The FY 2024-25 budget reflects a reimaging of service delivery, including eliminating duplications, identifying efficiencies, and other measures that do not significantly affect service to residents. The budget totals \$4.97 billion including the General Fund, Enterprise Funds, and Capital Funds. In addition to this, the budget ordinance approved on September 18 included \$291.1 million of appropriations for Internal Service Funds and the Employee Retirement Fund operation that are accounted for separately. The budget appropriation ordinance totaled \$5.26 billion.

We will closely monitor revenues and expenses and significant budget initiatives and report to you monthly through the Budget Accountability Report (BAR). This report is provided to the Government Performance and Financial Management Committee, as well as the entire City Council.
