BACKGROUND

The purpose of a service agreement is to establish firm pricing for services, for a specific term, which are ordered on an as needed basis. This action does not encumber funds.

This service agreement will be used for the litter pick-up maintenance service of every park within the City's six park maintenance districts. Contractors will perform litter pick-up services on a pre-determined maintenance frequency established by the Park and Recreation department.

Maintenance frequencies will vary in each park based on the amount of traffic and the time of year. Adjustments to the schedule will be based on variable needs such as special events and spray ground activity. The service contract also includes provisions for the removal of urban encampments, post flood clean-ups, illegal dumping and litter maintenance performed on an emergency response basis.

BACKGROUND

On November 13, 2019, a Request for Qualifications was issued for Professional Commissioning Services for the Hall of State, African American Museum and Coliseum Facility Improvements. On December 6, 2019, Statements of Qualifications were received from six firms. On December 18, 2019, the Selection Committee evaluated the six firms' submittals and determined that Facility Performance Associates, Inc. had the best qualifications and experience for this project.

This action will authorize Facility Performance Associates (FPA) to provide commissioning and related services such as design review, HVAC testing and balancing, documentation and analysis of system performance. Authorize adoption of new playground accessibility guidelines which seek to provide access to City of Dallas playgrounds for people of all ages and abilities – Financing: No cost consideration to the City.

BACKGROUND

This item authorizes the playground accessibility guidelines. The guidelines were developed to ensure City of Dallas playgrounds are accessible to everyone regardless of age or ability.

The Park and Recreation Department has 215 playgrounds in its system, consisting of 207 classified as ADA-Accessible, 4 classified as All-Accessible, and 4 classified as All-Inclusive. Following is a description of the different playground classifications.

ADA-Accessible

- Current standard for most playgrounds
- Surfacing and equipment are accessible to children of different abilities and comply with Federal Law
- Playground surfacing consists of engineered wood fiber which meets ADA requirements

All-Accessible

- Current standard for recent downtown parks
- Surface and equipment are accessible to children of different abilities
- Playground surfacing consists of poured in place material or artificial turf

All-Inclusive

- o Typically, are larger and serve a broader area
- Removes barriers to exclusion offering social interaction between people of all ages and abilities
- Surface type typically consists of poured in place material and can include artificial turf. Surface can include area(s) of engineered wood fiber depending on the equipment types and safety considerations

BACKGROUND - continued

To ensure playgrounds are accessible to as many users as possible, a set of guidelines were developed that aim to:

- Incorporate a combination of surface materials to remove barriers to access while also addressing cost and safety implications
- Select surface material based on type of equipment, and safety considerations
- Implement a City-wide, equitable distribution of larger and smaller all-inclusive playgrounds to serve community needs
- Develop a distribution of proposed all-inclusive playground locations. A map of proposed all-inclusive playground locations is attached.

PRIOR ACTION/REVIEW (COUNCIL, BOARDS, COMMISSIONS)

On January 23, 2020 the Park and Recreation Board was briefed on the draft playground accessibility guidelines during an annual retreat.

On February 6, 2020 the Planning and Design Committee was briefed on an updated set of guidelines developed after the January 23, 2020 Park Board retreat.
