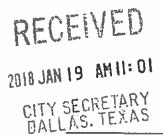

BACKGROUND

On September 22, 2015 a twenty-four month contract for Master Agreement BQ1532 – 2015 Pavement Repairs, Schedule E was authorized, Resolution number 151763. The contract was extended one year on August 23, 2017, Administrative Action number 170908.

The Park and Recreation Department is prepared to issue a notice to proceed for the removal of and replacement of an asphalt parking lot to include new asphalt surfacing, concrete curbs and gutters at the parking lot located at Samuell Grand Park, at the corner of Samuell Boulevard and Winslow Street.

This parking lot serves as the main parking lot for the adjacent soccer field. The current condition of the parking lot makes it difficult for vehicles to navigate and the lack of curbs and gutters does not allow for proper drainage during rain events.

All requests for Samuell Trust Fund disbursements equal to or greater than \$50,000 will require Park and Recreation Board approval.

BACKGROUND

The City Council authorized a contract with The Fain Group, Inc. on June 14, 2017 by Resolution No. 17-1085 for construction of three regional family aquatic centers at Crawford Memorial Park located at 375 South Prairie Creek Road, Fretz Park located at 14730 Hillcrest Road and Samuell Grand Park located at 3003 Samuell Boulevard in an amount not to exceed \$20,562,297.

This action is to authorize Change Order No. 1 to the contract with The Fain Group, Inc., in an amount not to exceed \$351,666.61, from \$20,562,297 to \$20,913,963.61, for an increase in the contract to modify the location of the filtration building to accommodate a future right-of-way on Hillcrest Road at Fretz Park; to re-route the existing water line which serves the recreation center and the aquatic center at Fretz Park; to install a three-phase primary electrical power feed at Crawford Memorial Park; and to add gates to the perimeter fence at Crawford Memorial Park and Samuell Grand Park aquatic centers.

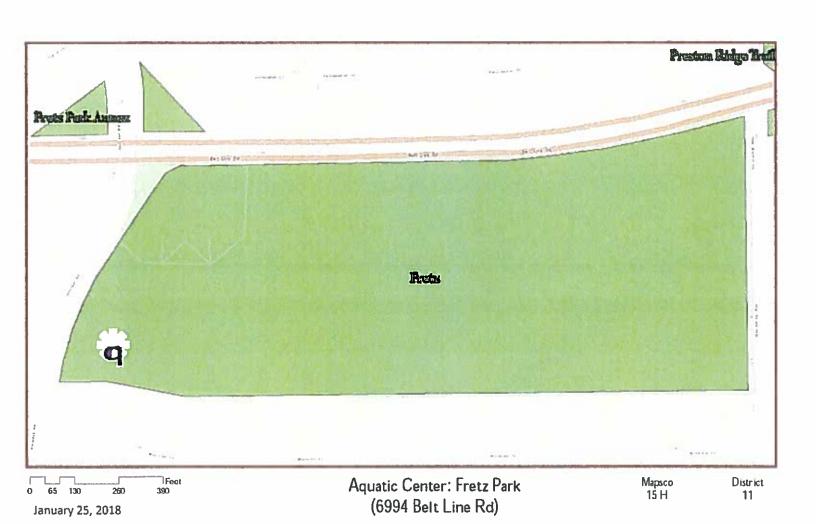

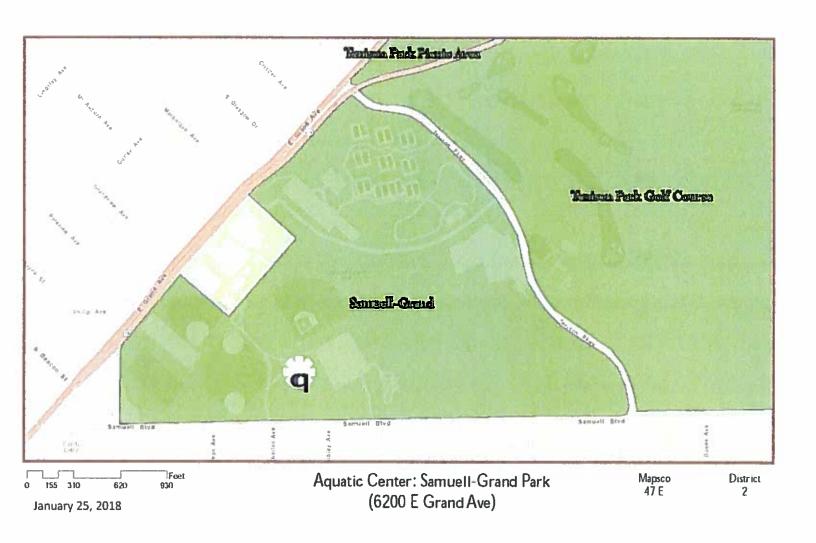

Authorize staff to proceed working with the Office of Economic Development to seek reauthorization of a Chapter 380 Economic Development Grant Agreement with ESPN in an amount not to exceed \$800,000 in consideration of bringing teams from the Big Ten, Big 12 or Conference USA to play in an annual bowl game at the Cotton Bowl Stadium at Fair Park in December of 2018 and 2019 pursuant to the City of Dallas Public/Private Partnership Program – Cost Not to Exceed \$800,000 – Financing: General Funds

BACKGROUND

The first Cotton Bowl collegiate game was held on January 1, 1937 at the Cotton Bowl Stadium with the TCU Horned Frogs defeating the Marquette Golden Avalanche, 16-6. A bowl game has been held at the Cotton Bowl Stadium each year since except in 2010. Except for the Rose Bowl, the Cotton Bowl Stadium has hosted more bowl games than any stadium in the United States.

On November 14, 2012 the City of Dallas and the Heart of Dallas, a Texas non-profit corporation, entered into a Chapter 380 Grant Agreement. Under the authority of Chapter 380 of the Texas Local Government Code, the City of Dallas has made grants of public money to (1) promote local economic development; and (2) stimulate business and commercial activity in the City of Dallas and more particularly within the South Dallas/Fair Park area, The City of Dallas desired to prove an economic incentive to the Heart of Dallas to bring teams from the Big Ten, Big 12, or Conference USA to play in an annual bowl game at the Cotton Bowl Stadium at Fair Park in order to promote with the City of Dallas and in particularly within the South Dallas/Fair Park area that would promote (1) development and diversification of the economy; (2) elimination of unemployment and the underemployment; and (3) development and expansion of commerce.

The Heart of Dallas expressed a commitment to contract with the City of Dallas to host bowl games with specified NCAA football conferences and in consideration for the completion and compliance of said functions, the City of Dallas committed to make an economic development grant to the Heart of Dallas of \$400,000, renewed annually at the sole discretion of the Dallas City Council for up to five (5) additional 12-month periods,

Authorize staff to proceed with pursuing a Chapter 380 Economic Development Grant Agreement with ESPN to bring teams in from the Big Ten, Big 12 or Conference USA to play in an annual bowl game at the Cotton Bowl Stadium at Fair Park in December of 2018 and 2019 – Cost Not to Exceed \$800,000 – Financing: Current Funds – page 2

subject to annual approval and appropriation by the Dallas City Council and continued statutory authorization of the incentive under the Act.

In 2013, ESPN took over management and operation of the Plains Capital Heart of Dallas Bowl and in 2014 Zaxby's became the title sponsor of the Bowl. The December 26, 2017 game was the final bowl game under the Chapter 380 Grant Agreement between the City of Dallas and Heart of Dallas/ESPN.

According to Visit Dallas, the bowl game on December 26, 2017 between Utah and West Virginia had an economic impact of \$7,024,513. The bowl game on December 27, 2016 between Army and North Texas had a total economic impact of \$5,903,619 and the bowl game played on December 26, 2014 between Louisiana Tech and Illinois had an economic impact of \$14,890,630.

Via a separate agreement, the Heart of Dallas/ESPN has two years remaining in a six-year partnership agreement with the Big 12 (seventh selection), Big Ten (ninth selection) and Conference USA. Remaining matchups include Conference USA versus Big Ten in 2018 and Conference USA versus Big 12.

On November 2, 2017, the Park and Recreation Board was briefed on the history of the bowl game and future funding Chapter 380 Economic Development Grant Agreement funding options. Staff is recommending that a new two-year funding agreement be pursued as a shorter term would result in better aligning of City of Dallas interests with contract terms of any new agreement between ESPN and the college conferences.

The proposed Chapter 380 Economic Development Grant Agreement is subject to the following key terms:

- 1. The grant shall be payable in two installments of \$400,000
 - The first installment will be payable in December 2018 upon completion and verification of ESPN bringing teams in from the Big Ten, Big 12 or Conference USA to play in an annual bowl game at the Cotton Bowl Stadium at Fair Park to promote with the City of Dallas, and in particularly within the South Dallas/Fair Park area that will promote development and diversification of the economy; elimination of unemployment and underemployment; and development and expansion of commerce
 - The second installment will be payable in December 2019 upon completion and verification of ESPN bringing teams in from the Big Ten, Big 12 or Conference USA to play in an annual bowl game at the Cotton Bowl Stadium at Fair Park to promote with the City of Dallas, and in particularly within the South Dallas/Fair Park area that will promote development and diversification of the economy; elimination of unemployment and underemployment; and development and expansion of commerce

Authorize staff to proceed with pursuing a Chapter 380 Economic Development Grant Agreement with ESPN to bring teams in from the Big Ten, Big 12 or Conference USA to play in an annual bowl game at the Cotton Bowl Stadium at Fair Park in December of 2018 and 2019 – Cost Not to Exceed \$800,000 – Financing: Current Funds – page 3

- 2. ESPN will contract with the City of Dallas to host bowl games in the Cotton Bowl Stadium with specified NCAA football conferences in 2018 and 2019
- 3. ESPN will organize and manage advertising, broadcasting, news media, promotional activities and other such related game functions
- 4. In consideration for the completion and compliance of said function, the City of Dallas commits to make a Chapter 380 Economic Development Grant Agreement to ESPN in an amount of \$800,000, payable in two installments of \$400,000 each December of 2018 and 2019
- The Chapter 380 Economic Development Grant Agreement shall renew each year at the sole discretion of the Dallas City Council for up to one (1) additional 12month period, subject to annual approval and appropriation by the Dallas City Council
- 6. Continued statutory authorization of this incentive under the Act
- 7. ESPN to host the annual bowl game at the Cotton Bowl Stadium at Fair Park in December 2018 and December 2019

Pursuant to the City of Dallas Public/Private Partnership (PPP) Program, Guidelines and Criteria (effective for the period of January 1, 2017 through December 31, 2018) the project does not meet the minimum eligibility requirements for a Non-Target Area.

Notwithstanding, the project represents a unique economic development opportunity and, as such is considered a "Non-Conforming Project" pursuant to the PPP Program. As a Non-Conforming Project, the proposed Grant requires approval by a three-fourths vote of the Dallas City Council.

BACKGROUND

Fair Park regularly welcomes visitors during various events. To create a safe and pleasant experience during each event, it is incumbent upon the City to provide experienced crowd management personal that can manage major public assemblies and able to respond accordingly in the event off an emergency. As part of the crowd management contractor's responsibilities, the contractor shall formulate event security plans that are compliant with Homeland Security guidelines, provide emergency plans according to the requirement of each function and provide incident reports after each event. Events are produced by clients of Fair Park and required crowd management services. The event producers negotiate the services needed with the City's contracted crowd management service provider. The service contract provides for crowd management services which includes, but is not limited to security screeners, police services/traffic control, ushers, ticket takers, door security and paramedic services.

On February 27, 2013, the City authorized a 36-month, with two one-year extensions, services contract between the City of Dallas and Platinum Event Services, Inc., to provide crowd management services at Fair Park for non-City sponsored events and City sponsored events. The current contract will expire on February 26, 2018.

On September 3, 2014, the Mayor's Fair Park Task Force briefed the City Council and the Park and Recreation Board on their recommendations for Fair Park that included (1) enhance access and connectivity with the community and city; (2) establish a community park on the south side of property, and (3) empower new organization as operational and marketing authority for Fair Park.

On September 18, 2014, the Park and Recreation Board was briefed on "The Future of Fair Park" which identified and addressed many issues related to a proposed change in governance. The briefing included an overview of campus members and service provider contracts, to include crowd management services.

City Council has not decided on the future of Fair Park; therefore, a long-term agreement is not recommended due to the possible transfer of Fair Park management to a private not for profit group. Extending the crowd management services agreement with Platinum Event Services, Inc. will allow for uninterrupted service to clients while insuring safe and secure events.

Staff is requesting that Park and Recreation Board authorize extending the contract with Platinum Event Services, Inc. to provide crowd management services at Fair Park for a period commencing on February 27, 2018 and terminating on February 26, 2019; contractor will pay 30.76% of gross sales, less sales tax to the City.

SUBJECT

Authorize a one-year agreement with the American National Red Cross (Red Cross), the Dallas Chapter, for the storage of disaster relief supplies, vehicles or other assets owned by the American Red Cross at Fair Park – No Cost Consideration to the City

BACKGROUND

The City of Dallas (City) has an agreement with the American National Red Cross (Red Cross), whereby City facilities are made available to temporarily shelter citizens as needed in response to local or national disaster events. In the event of a mass disaster and/or evacuation in Dallas, the plan identifies Fair Park as a probably staging and/or shelter site. The Red Cross must amass and stage equipment, supplies, vehicles and other assets to be prepared to respond to a mass disaster in Dallas. This agreement provides for the Red Cross to proactively place up to fifteen 8' X 20' containers and store emergency provisions (cots, blankets, comfort kits) on site.

Park Board approved an agreement with the Red Cross to store provisions at Fair Park on January 31, 2017. Staff is recommending a new one year agreement under the same terms as the current agreement:

- The location of the storage site (premises) is 1515 Bank Street, Dallas, TX 75210.
 The premises are managed by the Dallas Park and Recreation Department.
- Red Cross may store up to 15 storage units, sized approximately 8' wide by 20' long, positioned next to each other on the premises and stocked with supplies to meet the expected maximum occupancy/shelter resident capacity to be sheltered at Fair Park building facilities. Red Cross may park emergency vehicles in the storage site.
- The City will not charge Red Cross a fee for use of the premises.

Authorize a one year agreement with the American Red Cross to permit the storage of disaster relief supplies, vehicles or other assets owned by the American Red Cross at Fair Park – page 2

- The Agreement is revocable upon 30 days' notice by either party. Upon termination, Red Cross will vacate the premises and repair all damage caused by its occupancy at its sole expense.
- The Red Cross will keep the premises in good condition and promptly repair all damage to the premises, will not disrupt, adversely affect or interfere with other occupants on the premises. The Red Cross is exclusively responsible for its inventory.
- The City makes no warranty or representation about the premises, is under no obligation to prepare or repair the premises and provided the premises "As is".
- The City may terminate the Agreement for cause.
- The Red Cross indemnifies the City, its officers, agents and employees.
- The Red Cross shall carry insurance coverage in the amounts specified by the City.

BACKGROUND

The City, through the Park and Recreation Department, maintains Samuell Farm that is approximately 609 acres in size. DZM shall construct a 2-acre breeding facility for the Whooping Crane bird that will sit on approximately 5 acres near the west/southwest corner of Samuell Farm.

Obligation of the City of Dallas include the following:

1. Provide the land (approximately 5 acres) for use by DZM.

Obligations of Dallas Zoo Management include the following:

- 1. The term of the contract is for ten (10) years with two five (5) year renewal periods and allows the City to terminate on a 90-day notice.
- 2. DZM shall design, develop, construct, operate, maintain the breeding facility.
- 3. DZM at its sole cost shall undertake the development of the premises as approved by the Director or designee.
- 4. DZM shall provide educational and outreach programs to the public including schools and other groups, to present the conservation message about this endangered species.
- 5. DZM shall pay for all utilities.
