President Abtahi convened the regular meeting at 9:30 a.m. A quorum of the Board was present.

Agenda Item 1. Speaker: Ms. Nepha Love spoke about her great-great-grandparent, Anderson Bonner.

A motion by Jeff Kitner, seconded by Bo Slaughter to move items #14 and #15 forward for consideration at this time, and recommend approval of these two items, was carried. The vote was unanimous.

President Abtahi introduced the newest Park Board member: Taylor Toynes who represents District 3. Mr. Toynes introduced himself.

Agenda Item 2. A motion by Barbara Barbee, seconded by Bo Slaughter, to approve the minutes of the February 1, 2018 Park and Recreation Board Meeting, was carried. The vote was unanimous.

Reverchon Park (2) - A motion by Robb Stewart, seconded by Bo Slaughter, to authorize an alcohol permit request by Michael Luchsinger, to serve alcohol at the Carry the Load event to be held at Reverchon Park, located at 3505 Maple Avenue. White Rock Lake (9) — A motion by Robb Stewart, seconded by Becky Rader, to authorize a 36-month (3) year concession contract for the operation of a watercraft rental service at White Rock Lake with Ask Ace, LLC dba White Rock Paddle Company being the most advantageous proposer of two — Estimated Annual Revenue: \$59,800, with the following amendments added: 1) White Rock Paddle Company staff should all be certified in water safety and lifesaving training as certified by the Red Cross or YMCA or other similar entity, 2) lightning detection equipment should be installed on site, 3) and AED/defibrillator should be on site and the tenant should be allow to use capital improvement money to purchase the equipment, and 4) the tenant must have a rescue boat with a motor that is greater than 10.5 horsepower (HP) available for water rescue, was carried. Consulting Engineers, Inc. for schematic design through construction administration services for the Music Hall Exterior Lighting Improvements Project to be constructed at the Music Hall at Fair Park, located at 909 First Avenue – Not to exceed \$92,485 – Financing: Current Funds, was placed for discussion. After board discussion, Yolanda Williams moved, seconded by Rodney Schlosser (who withdrew his second), seconded by Bo Slaughter, to call the question. The motion to call the question was carried by 2/3 vote (10-5 with Dickey, Kitner, Moreno, Rader, Sims voting nay). The original motion by Ms. Woods, seconded by Mr. Slaughter was carried by majority vote. (13-2, Barbee and Moreno voting nay).



On September 3, 2014, the Mayor's Fair Park Task Force briefed the City Council and the Park and Recreation Board on their recommendations for Fair Park that included (1) enhance access and connectivity with the community and city; (2) establish a community park on the south side of property, and (3) empower new organization as operational and marketing authority for Fair Park.

On September 18, 2014, the Park and Recreation Board was briefed on "The Future of Fair Park" which identified and addressed several issues related to a proposed change in governance. The briefing included an overview of campus members and service provider contracts, to include food and beverage concessions.

Beginning in November 2014, Park and Recreation Board has on various occasions authorized extending the contract with vendors to operate food and beverage service at Fair Park while a determination was made in regards to Fair Park's future. The City agrees to provide any required documentation for fundraising or donor compliance and to implement the projects included in the DISD shared campus agreement subject to funding availability. Additionally, the City agrees to coordinate with TTF on design activities at the DISD project sites.

### BACKGROUND

The Cotton Bowl Stadium hosts a number sporting events each year to include the Dr. Pepper Dallas Cup Youth Soccer Tournament, international soccer matches, the Red River Showdown featuring the University of Texas and Oklahoma University, Grambling State versus Prairie View A&M University, the Heart of Dallas Bowl featuring teams from the Big 12, Big Ten and Conference USA and high school football matchups. Many of these events are televised nationally and internationally showcasing the stadium, Fair Park and the City of Dallas to audiences throughout the world.

Natural turf was reinstalled in the Cotton Bowl Stadium for the 1994 Federation Internationale de Football Association (FIFA) World Cup. The Stadium hosted six matches, including a quarter final match and was named the "best pitch" of all the U.S. venues. The current grass turf in Cotton Bowl Stadium was replaced with 419 Tifway in 2006. Since its installation twelve years ago, the turf has mutated into a variety of different grasses resulting in inconsistent growth, discolored mounds, and unreliable root systems.

In recent weeks, staff has worked with the City's Business Development and Procurement Services Department (BDPS) for the replacement and installation of a new turf field for the Cotton Bowl Stadium. As part of the solicitation process and in an effort to increase competition, BDPS used its procurement system to send out bid notifications to vendors registered under respective commodities. To further increase competition, BDPS used historical solicitation information, the internet, and vendor contact information obtained from user departments to contact additional vendors by phone. Additionally, the Office of Business Diversity's ResourceLINK Team sent notifications to 25 Chambers of Commerce organizations, the DFW Minority Business Council, and the Women's Business Council – Southwest to ensure maximum vendor outreach.



## **BACKGROUND**

The City Council authorized a contract with The Fain Group, Inc. on June 14, 2017 by Resolution No. 17-1085 for construction of three regional family aquatic centers at Crawford Memorial Park located at 375 South Prairie Creek Road, Fretz Park located at 14730 Hillcrest Road and Samuell Grand Park located at 3003 Samuell Boulevard in an amount not to exceed \$20,562,297.

The City Council authorized Change Order No. 1 to the contract with The Fain Group, Inc. on February 14, 2018 in an amount not to exceed \$351,666.61, from \$20,562,297 to \$20,913,963.61, for an increase in the contract to modify the location of the filtration building to accommodate a future right-of-way on Hillcrest Road at Fretz Park; to re-route the existing water line which serves the recreation center and the aquatic center at Fretz Park; to install a three-phase primary electrical power feed at Crawford Memorial Park; and to add gates to the perimeter fence at Crawford Memorial Park and Samuell Grand Park aquatic centers.





### SUBJECT:

Adopt a Park and Recreation Board rule pursuant to Section 32-11 of the Dallas City Code prohibiting the feeding of wildlife at Bachman Lake Park – No cost consideration to the City

## **BACKGROUND**

FAA mandated that all FAR Part 139 air carrier airports conduct a Wildlife Hazard Assessment. Based on the results of this assessment, Dallas Love Field was required to create a Wildlife Hazard Management Plan which was approved by the FAA on February 7, 2014. Bachman Lake Park was identified as high risk due to its proximity to the flight path and its attractiveness to wildlife species.

Currently, no city rules prohibit feeding of birds or wildlife at Bachman Lake Park. In 2014 in response to the Wildlife Hazard Management Plan, Dallas Park and Recreation placed signage in the park asking patrons to please not feed the wildlife. However, this request is currently unenforceable.

Despite previous efforts to manage the wildlife, bird strikes against aircraft have been increasing since 2014. Bird strikes represent a significant hazard to the safety of air traffic and have resulted in human casualties.

Under Section 32-11, the Park Board is authorized to promulgate and post rules affecting a specific park and a person who violates the rule is guilty of an offense, which is punishable by fine-only. Staff's proposed rule would make it an offense for anyone to feed wildlife at Bachman Lake Park.
