## City of Dallas Office of the City Auditor Independent Auditor's Report on Applying Agreed-Upon Procedures

Petition Processing by the City Secretary's Office

We have performed the procedures described in Attachment I, which were agreed to by the City Secretary's Office (SEC), solely to assist the City of Dallas (City) City Council and the SEC in evaluating the SEC's compliance with the requirements of the Texas Election Code, the Texas Local Government Code, and the Charter of the City of Dallas, Texas as specified in "City Secretary's Office Procedures Process for Checking Petition(s) for an Initiative, Referendum, Local Option, Charter Amendment, Council Recall" (ELE 01.00). The SEC is responsible for the establishment of the policies and procedures to comply with those requirements.

The Agreed-Upon Procedures are included in Attachment I. Exceptions were noted for procedures 8, 9, and 12. and were communicated to the SEC.

This Agreed-Upon Procedures engagement was conducted in accordance with United States generally accepted government auditing standards which incorporate attestation standards established by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants. The sufficiency of these procedures is solely the responsibility of the SEC. Consequently, we make no representations regarding the sufficiency of the procedures described in Attachment I either for the purpose for which this report has been requested or for any other purpose.

We were not engaged to and did not conduct an examination, the objective of which would be the expression of an opinion, or conclusion, respectively, on compliance. Accordingly, we do not express such an opinion or conclusion. Had we performed additional procedures, other matters might have come to our attention that would have been reported to you.

The purpose of this report on applying Agreed-Upon Procedures, as described in paragraph one above, is intended solely for the information and use of the Dallas City Council and the SEC and it is not intended to be and should not be used by anyone other than this specified party. Accordingly, this report is not suitable for any other purpose.
