Deferred Disposition Application

Deferred Disposition is a suspended sentence (probation). On your plea of guilty or no contest, the Judge will defer the finding of guilt until a later date, assess the applicable fees, and order you to comply with certain conditions. If you successfully comply with the terms, your case will be dismissed.

However, if you fail to comply with terms and conditions of Deferred Disposition a guilty judgment may be imposed and a conviction may be reported to the Texas Department of Public Safety in accordance with Texas Code of Criminal Procedure, Art. 27.14(c).

You may apply for Deferred Disposition via mail by submitting the items below within 21 days of the day you received your citation. The Judge will review your application and Deferred Disposition will only be granted at the discretion of the reviewing Judge.

The following items must accompany your signed application:

- 1. A copy of your valid State of Texas driver's license (not a Commercial Driver's License [CDL];
- 2. Payment (money order or cashier's check made payable to the "City of Dallas" in the amount that corresponds to the violation on the <u>deferred fee schedule listed on the webpage</u>. (Include the case number(s) on the check or money order to ensure proper processing)).

Requests by mail will *not* be accepted for the offenses listed below.

- 25 miles or more over the posted speed limit or in excess of 95 mph
- Any offense by a holder of CDL (Commercial Driver's License)
- Passing a school bus
- Any traffic violation that occurred in a construction zone with workers present
- Non-traffic cases
- Juvenile cases (must appear in person with parent or guardian)

Defendants who are age 24 or younger at the time of the alleged offense must also complete a Driver Safety Course in addition to complying with the terms of deferred disposition by mail.
