



March 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016 Comparison




Live Release Rate for Dogs & Cats is up from 31.9% in March 2011 to 71.6% in March 2016

* 71.6% Live Release Rate is calculated by dividing total live outcomes (adoptions, outgoing transfers, return to owner/guardian) by total outcomes less unhealthy, owner requested euthanasia. March 2013, 2014, 2015, and 2016 Comparison




1,342 Total Live Releases of Dogs & Cats for March 2016, up from 700 in March 2011

March 2013, 2014, 2015, and 2016 Comparison




A new record March low for humane euthanasia of dogs and cats, down from 1,491 in March 2011

March 2016 Top Five Transfer Partners




Our Transfer Partners play a vital role in saving more lives.
