Meet MeLissa Webber - Interim Director

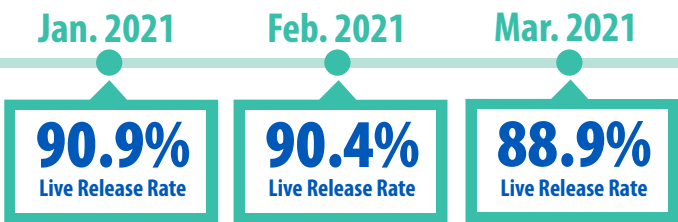
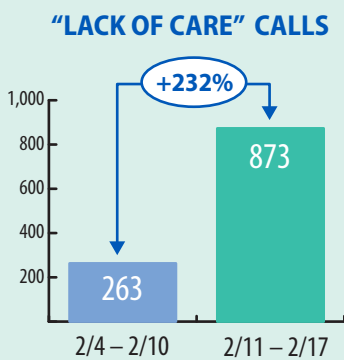
After Ed Jamison announced he would be moving on from Dallas Animal Services in March, the City of Dallas named Assistant Director MeLissa Webber as DAS' Interim Director. MeLissa joined the Dallas90 team in February 2020 from Los Angeles Animal Services (one of only a handful of shelters that, over their six locations, has a higher intake than DAS). MeLissa has played a vital role in helping DAS continue to increase public safety, lifesaving, and prioritizing both people and pets in our community during one of the most challenging years in history. Under her direction, we are confident that our team will continue the lifesaving Dallas90 effort without skipping a beat. We are excited to have such a strong leader to guide us!



February Winter Weather Response

In February 2021, Winter Storm Uri tore through the state of Texas, leaving behind treacherous road conditions and many without power and water. Our Animal Services Officers worked around-the-clock to respond to the 26% increase in total Service Requests from the Dallas community and a 232% increase in "lack of care" calls – most of which were welfare checks on pets spotted outdoors in the bitter cold.

Our shelter and medical teams also provided care, enrichment, surgeries and medical treatment to pets at the shelter throughout the storm. Thanks to their commitment, we were able to keep Dallas pets safe, provide top-notch care and find positive outcomes for pets even in the hardest conditions!

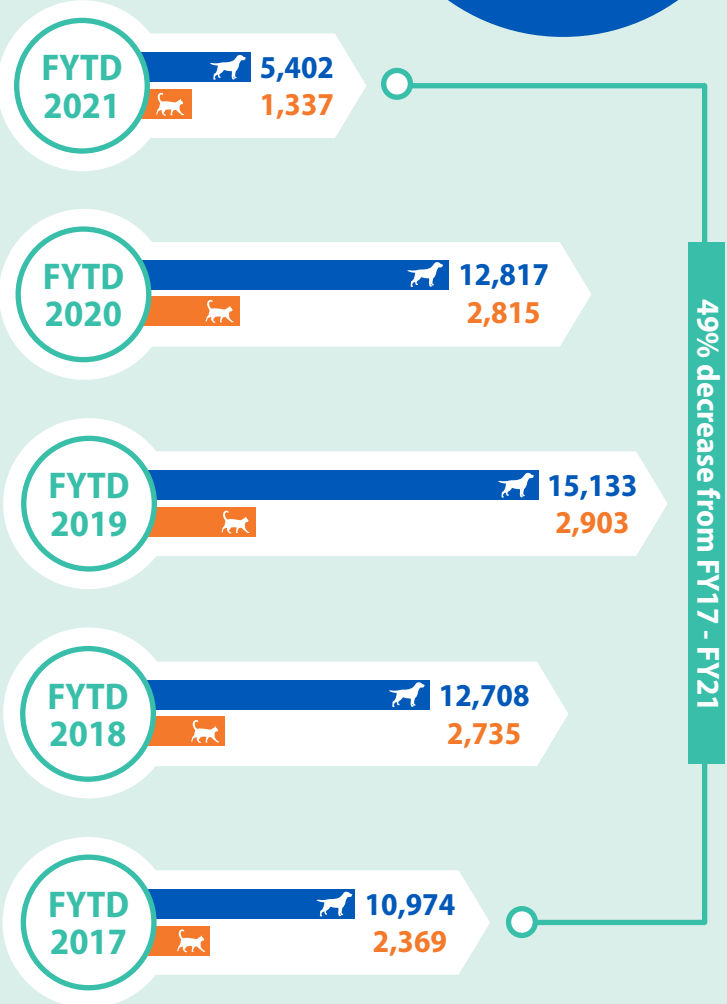

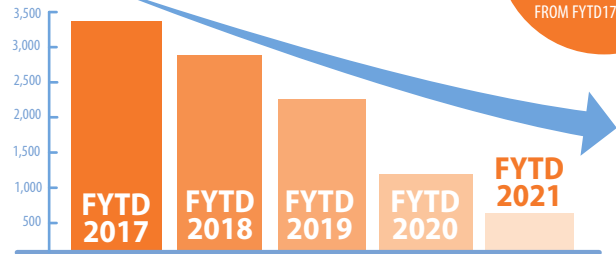

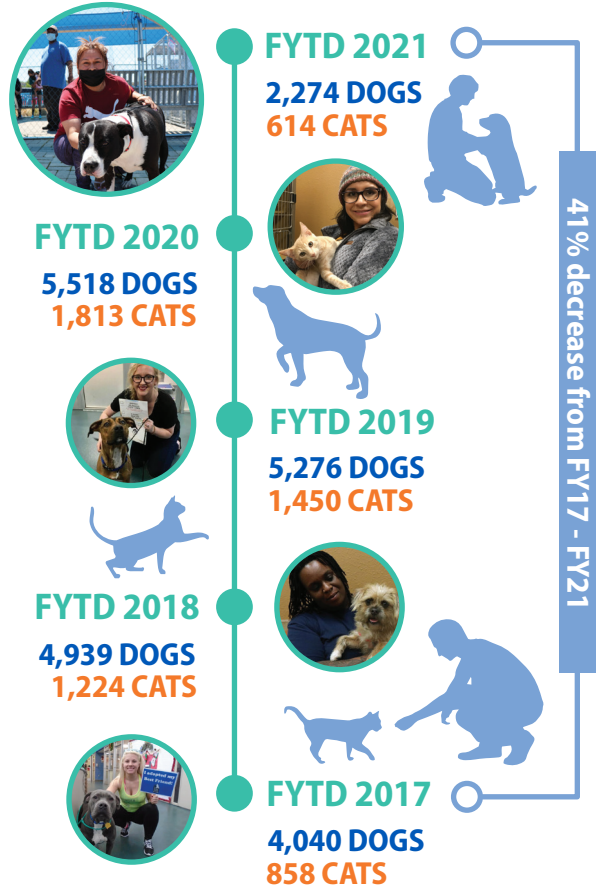

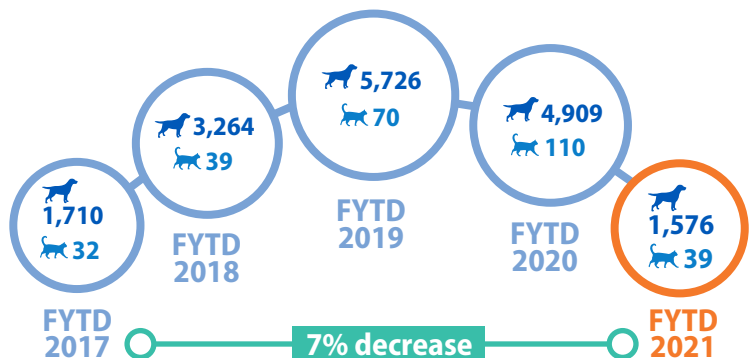
ADOPTIONS

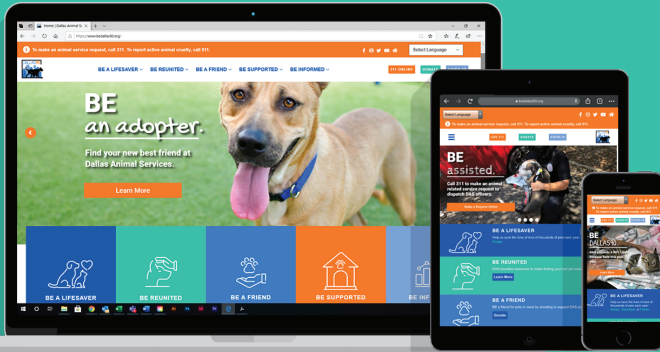
