SUBJECT Department of Housing Performance Measure Update

The Department of Housing and Neighborhood Revitalization reports project pipelines and accomplishments to the Housing & Homelessness Solutions Committee on a monthly basis. The updated presentation is attached, and details are included below:

Development

In January, Council approved funding for a project submitted by St. Jude that will include the substantial rehabilitation of a hotel into 180 permanent supportive housing units. The Ridge at Lancaster, a 300-unit project previously supported via Low Income Housing Tax Credits (LIHTC), has applied for their build permit with a request for the Mixed Income Housing Development Bonus. The Land Transfer program also received an application to purchase 59 lots in the Bonton, Ideal, Jubilee, and Paul Quinn clusters that staff is currently processing.

Single-family projects currently under construction are nearing completion, so housing completions will slow until newer projects begin construction including Singleton Estates in West Dallas and all projects approved in the 2020 Single-Family NOFA.

Repair

New repair programs are beginning to open for Dallas residents. The Targeted Repair Program for West Dallas and Tenth Street Historic District have opened, with staff receiving 63 applications from West Dallas and 7 for Tenth Street. These applications remain open to ensure all funding will be spent. The lead testing and remediation program is also currently accepting applications. Staff have received 36 applications and preapproved 3 applicants for inspection and potential repairs. The Dallas Tomorrow Fund is also moving, with 28 applications received and 22 applicants pre-approved and moved to inspection.

The primary repair program, Home Improvement and Preservation Program (HIPP), is continuing to move despite the lack of change in these performance measures. In January staff executed contracts for most of the repair projects approved in 2020 and construction will begin on them very soon. As contractors finish these repairs, they will be able to contract with households preapproved during this application cycle.

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DHAP

The Dallas Homebuyer Assistance Program (DHAP) is continuing to see movement with 1 new application, 1 client prequalified, and 1 loan closed in January. This loan is the first taking advantage of targeted occupation assistance serving educational instruction and library occupations, healthcare practitioners and technical occupations, healthcare support occupations, and protective service occupations. Radio ads for DHAP have started to air on KERA. Other marketing opportunities to include radio and television via Radio One and Estrella Media will soon be underway to air within the first quarter in 2021. With these marketing opportunities, the upcoming tax season yielding in refunds and record low interest rates, staff anticipates an increase of inquiries to the program.

MRAP

The Mortgage and Rental Assistance Program (MRAP) saw another surge in residents served, 792 in January, as some nonprofit partners provided their updates this month. The portion of Coronavirus Relief Fund (CRF) dedicated to MRAP was expended prior to December 31, and staff expects to continue serving residents through the first quarter of 2021 using the remaining Community Development Block Grant funds allocated to the effort.

Other

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The units supported by other departments has been updated with housing units currently supported by the Office of Homeless Solutions, including the St. Jude project which included CRF funding for the permanent supportive housing units. Units permitted by the city saw a very large jump in January due to two very large market-rate multifamily projects receiving their permits.


