Challenges

1. Code Enforcement

• Homes not maintained, loose/dead animals, rats/mosquitos, yard maintenance, several others

2. Property Value, Development/large houses out of context

3. Infrastructure Needs

• Sidewalks, alleys, streets, lights

4. Absentee Landlords

• Lease homes without repairing, buying up properties

5. Lack of Parks/ Open Space

Priorities

1. Managing neighborhood change:

• Preventing displacement, encouraging diversity, concerns over mega mansions

- Home repair
- Code enforcement


Rapid Response Actions

Enhanced/ Community Sensitive Code Strategy

- Outreach and education: Code Crawl, Neighborhood Clean-up/festival,
- Access to services: workshops, home repair incentive program, other public, neighborhood, and private resources
- Enhanced enforcement
- DPD to assign more officers to patrol
 - Get the word out on car break-ins
- Bond program priorities: streets, sidewalks, alleys




1. Neighborhood is growing faster than the city as a whole

3. Homestead exemptions

-City of Dallas, Dallas County: 20% deducted off value of home for tax purposes -DISD 10%

4. Senior exemptions

-County and school taxes are capped for over 65 -City of Dallas deducts 64,000 off value of home for tax purposes Strategic Neighborhood Action Plan:
