Overview

Below is a summary of Urban Design Peer Review Panel advice for the Lakeridge Village Shopping Center project, as derived from the May 26th Peer Review session.

Advice Summary

- [1] The panel recommends utilizing integrated storm water management (iswm) site development strategies as organizing systems for the overall landscape design.
- [2] Consider stronger articulation of pedestrian paths through additional landscape buffers and treatments.
- [3] The panel supports and applauds the inclusion of an internal pocket greenspaces as an amenity for the overall development and neighborhood. The panel further suggests exploring a variety of potential alternatives for the design and location of the greenspace such as:
 - Explore relocating the greenspace along the opposite side of the pedestrian pathway to leverage the existing trees along the western edge of the surface parking field.
 - Explore relocating the greenspace directly adjacent to the eastern building frontages to directly integrate with tenant uses and outdoor seating.
 - Consider the opportunity to reorient the plaza east-west along the southern portion of the parking field as a means of negotiating grade within the site.
- [4] The panel supports augmenting the existing surface parking area with additional tree canopy.
- [5] The panel recommends giving further attention to the primary entries into the site to create a level of visual hierarchy indicating and announcing entry into the development.
- [6] Explore the impact of realigning offset parking bays to unify and organize pedestrian paths and drives.
- [7] The panel advises staff to explore the extension existing cycle infrastructure from the south northward into the site.
