



This plan will be a guide for:

- Implementation: this plan will lead to action and sustainable impact
- Balanced Development: between growth and land values for current property owners
- The Citywide Vision: SD/FP will be incorporated into the broader ForwardDallas vision
- Residents and Businesses: the community will be informed about City initiatives impacting SD/FP
- **Resources**: this plan will help identify and leverage public and private funding

GUIDING PRINCIPALS: LAND USE + ZONING



- Amend land use policy and zoning regulations that address incompatibility between uses and promote vibrant neighborhoods and thriving commercial corridors.
- Repurpose vacant and/or underutilized land to a use that contributes positively to the surrounding area.
- Review locations within existing neighborhoods where different housing types, including tiny homes and small multi-plexes (ex: duplex, triplex, 4-plex), may be appropriate to ensure housing choice for people of all ages and income levels.

GUIDING PRINCIPALS: HOUSING



- Ease displacement pressure on existing residents while creating diverse housing options for new residents.
- Align opportunities for new housing development with the needs of diverse residents, considering incomes, age and diverse family needs.
- Preserve existing housing stock for current homeowners and renters and improve code compliance for unsafe or unmaintained buildings.
- Establish design guidelines for new residential development that respects the context of traditional area development and provides amenities for current and future residents. New development should add value to the existing neighborhood.

GUIDING PRINCIPALS: ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT



- Pursue catalytic opportunities for commercial and residential development and redevelopment.
- Promote small businesses and neighborhood-focused businesses to establish SD/FP as a destination.
- Encourage businesses that are compatible with surrounding residences.
- Foster creation of walkable commercial corridors with small businesses, green spaces, pocket parks and recreation.

GUIDING PRINCIPALS: INFRASTRUCTURE



- Weave neighborhoods together by connected streets, sidewalks, access to goods & services and community gathering spaces.
- Increase lighting, safety and police visibility to improve area's image and aesthetic appeal.
- Strategically deploy and monitor City investment: Bond Program, CDBG, Parks, Transportation and Public Works.
- Improve street design & connectivity within the planning area.
- Improve broadband access throughout the area.
- Protect the area from flooding.
- Improve air quality.

GUIDING PRINCIPALS: COMMUNITY WELLBEING




- Implement land use policies, tools, and incentives that support improved health, safety, and quality of life for residents.
- Promote parks, trails and connections to those parks and trails.
- Incentivize access to healthy food stores.

GUIDING PRINCIPALS: HISTORY/CULTURE



- Protect, support, and celebrate SD/FP history, culture, people, and architecture.
- Promote urban design that respects the historic design and architecture of the area.
- Promote and support community spaces that celebrate the community's history.
- Support local small businesses and entrepreneurs, especially along cultural corridors such as 2nd Avenue, MLK, Jr and Malcolm X.













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

Malcolm X Corridor MLK Jr. Blvd / Malcolm X





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
