


- Using initial input from public meetings and Social Pinpoint, PUD met with Transportation to begin to identify strategies and recommendations

Phased approach proposed by Heritage Oak Cliff

•

- Divide West Oak Cliff into 3 areas based off neighborhood characteristics and "risk to gentrifying"
- Goal would be to tackle Area 1 first, then 2, then 3


- 1. Add representatives from the 3 new associations being formed to the taskforce
- 2. Host **neighborhood-focused vision workshops** in Fall to develop detailed future land use vision for these areas and inform authorized hearing visioning
- Use NAs to vet land use recommendations detailed in rough draft of plan, in addition to holding public meetings*

AREAS WITHOUT NA REPRESENTATION

- 1. Partner with local organizations/ neighborhood leaders to conduct targeted outreach to inform residents about upcoming public meetings and the area planning effort more generally.
- 2. Conduct **targeted capacity building workshops** in these areas prior to neighborhood visioning workshops.
- 3. Conduct **neighborhood visioning workshops**. (will focus primarily on Open Space, Infrastructure, and other concerns)
- Make no recommended land use changes to these areas unless explicitly requested, but will make recommendations related to Parks + Open Space, Transportation + Infrastructure, and Community Development *

* Targeted outreach will be conducted in **all areas**, with particular focus on unrepresented areas, to inform all residents about recommendations outlined in rough draft of plan. Community meetings will be held to receive public feedback.

Note: Engagement should occur in-person via open house to maximize the quality and quantity of the input and enable Spanish language needs to be addressed more effectively. But we will continue to monitor COVID-19 and will conduct meetings in the safest format.












