SUMMARY OF FOCUS



Land Use + Development

- Preserve existing singlefamily neighborhood while allowing for new housing in appropriate locations and compatible "gentle density"
- · Ensure important historic structures are able to find new life through reformed parking requirements
- New commercial/ mixed-use development compatible with surrounding neighborhoods
- New compatible, mixeduse neighborhood-centered developments around DART stations



Transportation + Infrastructure

- Improvements needed to sidewalk, especially around schools, parks, and DART stations.
- Desire for new bike lanes, road diets/traffic calming, and pedestrian improvements on retail corridors
- Improved bus and multimodal transportation options around area, especially near DART stations
- · Concerns about public safety on streets, particularly related to street racing and lighting



Parks + Open Space

- Desire for improved open space connections and new trails
- Desire for new open spaces in areas currently lacking green space
- Desire to preserve existing tree canopy and enhance natural assets



Community Development

- Desire for focusing on local, neighborhoofocused retail + development
- Concerns about lack of housing and retail affordability, potential gentrification, and displacement due to development pressures and new development
- Desire for tools and policies that allow existing residents to remain in place




CURRENT BOUNDARY




The Dallas Strategic Mobility Plan evaluated 500+ projects from the Dallas Bike Plan, Needs Inventory, Trails Plan, NCTCOG Mobility 2045, etc.

Some projects scored more highly than others based of evaluation criteria such as safety, equity, sustainability, and innovation

Projects in the West Oak Cliff Study Area:

- 1. Shared Use Path on Illinois between Cockrell Hill and Hampton
- 2. Roadway improvements on Coombs Creek Drive
- 3. Bike lanes on 12th, Clarendon, and Plymouth
- 4. Pedestrian/trail enhancements around Hampton Station

DART ZOOM [DRAFT]




- DART is proposing an update to their bus network. If adopted, it would be implemented in January 2022.
- Proposed network would:
- Remove routes on Davis (542, 568), Edgefield (21), Ferndale, and Berkley
- Increase frequency on Jefferson, Cockrell Hill, Illinois, Tyler/Vernon
- Would add a new route on Wright
- Routes would remain unchanged on Clarendon, Westmoreland, and Hampton.
- There will be a public meeting at Noon on April 22nd for SW Dallas.



- Are currently developing a greenway and trail system along Five Mile creek to the south of the West Oak Cliff area

Texas Trees Foundation

- Partnering with DISD on their "Cool Schools" initiative to utilize school land for recreational opportunities
- Stockard Middle School is one of the pilot schools

Purpose:


- To capture feedback about how the community would like to see the study area grow and develop over time.
- Capture specific input on existing land use issues, locations/opportunities for future development, street and infrastructure improvements, open space/parks concerns, and other community development concerns such as gentrification




LAND USE/DEVELOPMENT VISIONING



SURVEY/FEEDBACK TOOL

- This will involve numerous meetings with relevant city departments (Transportation, Sustainable Development) and stakeholder groups (DART, Trust for Public Lapt;)
- We will also conduct some design charrettes for the key focus areas. Please let us know if you would be interested in being involved in those meetings.
- Once a draft is written, we will present it to the taskforce for initial feedback.
