The meeting was moved to the City Council Chambers, Room 6EN. Jesse Moreno, District 2 (Member of the Parks and Trails Subcommittee) served in Ben Leal's absence.

- 1. The Citizens Bond Task Force (CBTF) reviewed each subcommittee recommendation. Staff answered questions on the specific projects.
- 2. The CBTF reviewed and voted on each project. There were three voting options for each project:
 - A. Yes/Yes = Support for the recommended project and the recommended funding amount
 - B. Yes/No = Support for the recommended project but not the recommended funding amount
 - C. No = Do not support the recommended project for the funding amount
 - D. Any project that received a Yes/No or a No would be up for discussion on Thursday, May 18th
 - E. The summarized results are below:
 - 1) Streets Proposition
 - a. All projects passed, except the following which will be discussed on Thursday May 18th:
 - i. McKinney Ave/Cole Two Way Conversion
 - Pemberton Hill Road ii.
 - b. A motion was made to approve the District Allocation Formula that was recommended by the Streets Subcommittee. The motion passed 8-7.

- 2) Flood Proposition
 - a. All projects passed
- 3) Parks and Tails
 - a. All projects passed, except the following which will be discussed on Thursday May 18th:
 - i. Downtown Parks
 - ii. Circuit Trail
 - iii. Southern Gateway
 - iv. Kleberg Trail
 - v. Land Acquisition
 - b. A motion was made to make the allocation for District Specific Projects to be a minimum amount. The motion passed.
- 4) Critical Facilities
 - a. All projects passed, except the following which will be discussed on Thursday May 18th:
 - i. Southeast Fleet Service Center
 - ii. City Hall
 - iii. Dallas Museum of Art Fire Control and Sprinkler System
 - iv. Meyerson
 - v. Reality Based Training Village
- 5) Economic Development and Housing
 - a. The funding was approved, but they did not approve the Subcommittee's recommendation for using the funds. Specifically, the housing trust fund. The recommendation will be discussed at the meeting on Thursday, May 18th.
- 3. For the next meeting, CBTF members can provide recommendations on how money can be reallocated amongst the propositions to ensure critical projects are kept. The CBTF will discuss these recommendations to help determine their final list. The CBTF reiterated that they need to stay within \$800M set by the City Council. It was also concluded that cuts could be made to help fund projects in other propositions. The CBTF will also review the Economic Development and Housing recommendation.
