# What Is a Capital Bond Program?

- A voter-approved debt paid by the City to be used for projects such as:
  - Street and thoroughfare improvements
  - Flood protection and storm drainage
  - Park and recreation facilities
  - Library facilities
  - Economic development and diverse housing projects
  - Public safety facilities
  - Other critical City facilities
- Non-eligible projects include:
  - Public safety salaries
  - Routine operation and maintenance activities
  - Code enforcement initiatives

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

# Proposed 2017 Capital Bond Program Propositions

- Total Bond Program = \$1.025 Billion
- Specific funding amounts in each proposition are still being determined
  - City staff is working with Councilmembers to finalize allocations for each proposition



## **District 7 Streets and Transportation Projects**

- Traffic Signal Installations
  - Buckner (Loop 12) and Windsor Station
  - Buckner and Norvell
  - Forney and Prairie Creek
- Railroad Quiet Zones\*
- Prairie Creek Bridge over UPRR Tracks
- Dolphin Road from Haskell to Spring
- Pemberton Hill from Great Trinity Forest Parkway to Lake June Road\*
- Trojan St. Burma Road to Fellows Ln. (Street Petition)
- Jeffries St. Tanner St. to Warren Ave. (Sidewalk Petition)



- Current amount for District 7 parks in the needs inventory is \$296.2M




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### **System-Wide Park Projects:**

- Circuit Trail (The LOOP):
  - White Rock Creek Trail from I-30 to Lawnview
- Aquatics Master Plan Phase 2A:
  - Replacement of Exline Pool with a Neighborhood Aquatic Family Aquatic Center
- MLK Jr. Recreation Center:
  - Plumbing Correction
- Mildred Dunn Recreation Center:
  - Plumbing and HVAC corrections

# **District 7 Flood Control Projects**

- Each Council District is being allocated funds for:
  - Flood Protection Projects
  - Storm Drainage Projects
  - Erosion Control Projects
- City Staff is working with City Councilmembers to finalize projects for each District



# **District 7 Facilities Projects**

### **Cultural Arts**

 South Dallas Cultural Center: Erosion control at Robert E. Cullum entrance; repaying and re-landscaping; upgrade of building security and fire systems, including security cameras and exterior lighting

### **Public Safety**

- Fire Station #24 (2524 Elsie Faye Higgins St.): Plumbing, electrical and HVAC corrections
- Fire Station #53 (1407 John West Dr.): HVAC and electrical corrections



# **Economic Development and Housing**

- Economic Development
  - Facilitate Revitalization of Commercial Corridors, Mixed Income Housing and Development
- Housing
  - Permanent Supportive and Transitional Housing

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

  - Hall of State
  - Magnolia Lounge
  - Music Hall
  - Pan American Complex
  - Science Place 1
  - Texas Discovery Gardens
  - Tower Building
