## Technology -Accela



- Kickoff meeting –May 1st, 2023
- Core Team review of the approved Statement of Work [SOW]

## Technology - Call Center



- New call center system allows now to generate activity report
- Building Inspections (BI) Dashboard allows to see realtime information
  - Number of calls
  - Status of agents
  - Average hold times
  - Average handle times
- Currently waiting on profiles settings to allow saving information on each call.



## New Initiatives –Affordable Housing



- Two senior plans examiners and one project coordinator.
- 500 upcoming projects through the Housing And Neighborhood Revitalization Department.
- 20 projects have been reviewed and approved through this program.

- Consultant services retained
- Draft Program Guidelines in review

# New Initiatives — Same-day Fire Plan Review



- Moving gradually to 100% electronic Fire plan submittals.
- Electronic submittals will also include leveraging third-party review.
- Reduce the turnaround review time significantly.
- Develop plan for same-day fire plan review



## New Initiatives — Third-Party plan Review for DISD



- Currently paper submittals only.
- Transition to 100% electronic submittals.
- 41 projects currently in review, 56 projects in the pipeline to be submitted.
- Partnering with third-party review vendor to assist with qualifying projects.



## New Initiatives – Streamline Commercial Plan Review



- Commercial projects have been allowed to initiate the permit process while outstanding land development items are in the process.
- Attempted parallel reviews artificially inflates permitting times.
- A linear review process will allow development services to more accurately reflect the building permit review times.



## Recruitment and Hiring




- From a total of 344 positions in the department, 51 positions were still vacant at the end of April.
- Hiring event to be held on May 10.
- Recruitment and retention strategies are being evaluated.

## Residential New Single Family Permits-Staff Time Median Days (calendar days) to Issue YTD Comparison



A decrease of 18 days from the previous month.


Submittals that did not require customer revisions in March were issued in 7 median days.

### **Metrics-Subdivision Plats**



- Averaging 25 to 30 preliminary plats processed per month.
- 15 preliminary plats and approximately 10 to 15 early releases monthly.
- Currently, there are approximately 900 active plats.



## **Metrics –Subdivision Plats**



- Averaging 25 to 30 preliminary plats being processed a month
- 15 final plats recorded and 10 to 15 early releases per month.
- Currently here are 900 active plats.



## Relocation to 7800 N Stemmons - update



- Phase I of the move is expected to occur mid-June.
- Development Services is coordinating with Bond Office and contractors to establish dates for the following phases.
