It will certainly increase density, which drives other markets such as office and retail, and could increase diversity, which should drive inclusion, tolerance, equality, and justice in a positive direction over the long term. 3. It gives property owners the ability to be creative and make choices about how they want to use their property, including using it to produce or reinforce their income, which should already be a right for property owners in a free nation.
