Purpose

History

- 2012 foot pursuit resulting in an Officer Involved Shooting
- Committee assembled, including members from employee associations, to develop a policy on foot pursuits
- Draft policy reviewed by Command Staff and patrol officers of varying seniority
- Final draft submitted to Chief Brown and policy implemented September 18, 2013

Policy Guidelines

- The primary focus of this policy is officer safety
- An officer's decision to pursue on foot shall be made with an awareness of the risk to which the officer and others will be exposed
 - 1. Provide guidelines for initiating a pursuit
 - 2. Establish criteria for terminating a foot pursuit
 - 3. Provide tactical considerations to avoid pursuits, alternatives to pursuits and safety considerations

Critical Policy Points

- Policy defines Foot Pursuits
- Provides Strategies to Prevent Pursuits:
 - Tactical positioning
 - Talking with a calm voice
 - Officer presence, taking control of the situation
- Considerations when Initiating a Foot Pursuit
- Accountability and Responsibility
 - Pursuing officers
 - Supervisors
 - Communications
- Specific Criteria to Discontinue a Foot Pursuit
