BACKGROUND

On September 28, 2005, City Council authorized a thirty-six-month agreement to promote the city's Water Conservation and Recycling programs through environmental educational presentations at local schools, as well as community events.

Thousands of school-age children residing in the City learned about environmental stewardship governing water conservation and recycling efforts offered by the City. Teachers also benefited from this program through educational workshops enabling them to further emphasize the importance of being an environmental steward. The program's efforts not only touched the students but their family members and neighbors too, and is one of the contributing factors towards the growth of the "Too Good to Throw Away" Recycling Program.

Maintaining this momentum is critical; therefore, the city issued a new Request for Proposal on June 12, 2008 seeking vendors' submission for a five (5) year Environmental Educational Initiative (EEI) contract. Two qualified proposals were received, with the University of North Texas selected as the most advantageous proposer.

BACKGROUND (Continued)

The University of North Texas will assist the City in continuing the EEI Program that is serving Dallas children. The project is designed to merge existing and future environmental initiatives of the City into one cohesive unit from which teachers may choose desired topics. A multimedia incentive training tool (CD-Rom) will be added to the teacher workshops enabling them to conduct environmental lessons from the classroom.

A five member committee from these departments reviewed and evaluated the proposals:

- Sanitation
- Water Utilities
- Public Information Office

The successful proposer was selected by the committee on the basis of the demonstrated competence and qualifications under the following criteria:

•	Experience in the field	34 points
•	Presentation and Communication	24 points
•	Work Plan	20 points
•	Financial stability of Company	22 points

The University of North Texas, non-profit entity that is normally exempted from GFE requirements, has opted to engage minority services up to 10.27% of the total contract amount.

As part of the solicitation process and in an effort to increase competition, Business Development and Procurement Services (BDPS) used its procurement system to send out 113 email bid notifications to vendors registered under respective commodities. To further increase competition, BDPS uses historical solicitation information, the internet, and vendor contact information obtained from user departments to contact additional vendors by phone. Additionally in an effort to secure more bids, notifications were sent by the BDPS' ResourceLINK Team (RLT) to 25 chambers of commerce, the DFW Minority Business Council and the Women's Business Council – Southwest, to ensure maximum vendor reach.

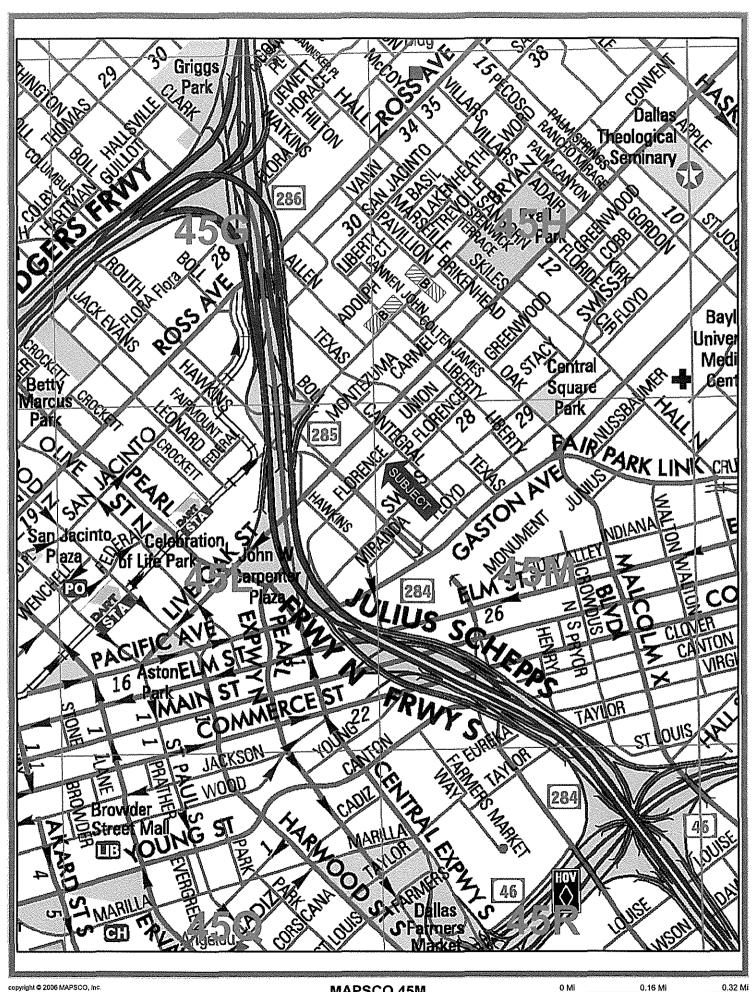

ORDINANCE NO.	

An ordinance providing for the closure and vacation of a portion of Florence Street adjacent to City Blocks M/270 and M/271 in the City of Dallas and County of Dallas, Texas; providing for the waiver of certain provisions of the Dallas Development Code; providing for the terms, provisions and effective date of the closure and vacation made herein; and providing an effective date for this ordinance.

WHEREAS, the Office of Economic Development Department has requested the closure and vacation of a portion of Florence Street for the construction of a parking garage for the Latino Cultural Center; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Dallas, acting pursuant to law, is of the opinion that the best interest and welfare of the public will be served by closing and vacating a portion of Florence Street adjacent to city-owned property in City Blocks M/270 and M/271 to all vehicular and pedestrian traffic; Now, Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DALLAS:

SECTION 1. That those certain provisions of Section 51A-8.506(b) of the Dallas Development Code regarding dead-end streets, to the extent not required by state law or City Charter, are hereby waived with respect to this ordinance.

SECTION 2. That the tract of land described in Exhibit A, which is attached hereto and made a part hereof, be and the same is hereby vacated and closed insofar as the right, title and easement of the public to use said tract for pedestrian and vehicular purposes are concerned; subject, however, to the conditions hereinafter more fully set out.

SECTION 3. That the closure and vacation provided for herein are made subject to all present zoning and deed restrictions, if the latter exist, and are subject to all existing easement rights of others, if any, whether apparent or non-apparent, aerial, surface, underground or otherwise, and are subject to existing and retained rights of the City to use the property described in Exhibit A for water, wastewater and drainage purposes and the presently existing facilities, if any, for all public utility and fiber optic franchisees, which facilities shall remain in place pursuant to the respective franchise agreements with those companies.

SECTION 4. That in connection with the closure and vacation of the portion of Florence Street described in Exhibit A, the Office of Economic Development shall:

a) make payment arrangements for all expenses for the relocation or removal of ONCOR Electric Delivery facilities located in the area described in Exhibit A to the satisfaction and approval of ONCOR Electric Delivery and ensure that said relocation or removal of these facilities is completed to the satisfaction and approval of ONCOR Electric Delivery before any demolition or construction in the area described in Exhibit A;

b) make payment arrangements for all expenses for the relocation or removal of Time Warner Cable facilities located in the area described in Exhibit A to the satisfaction and approval of Time Warner Cable and ensure that said relocation or removal of these facilities is completed to the satisfaction and approval of Time Warner Cable before any demolition or construction in the area described in Exhibit A.

SECTION 5. That the City Secretary is hereby authorized and directed to certify a copy of this ordinance for recordation in the Deed Records of Dallas County, Texas, which certified copy shall be delivered to the Director of Development Services, or her designee.

SECTION 6. That this ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and publication in accordance with the provisions of the Charter of the City of Dallas, and it is accordingly so ordained.

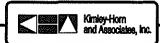

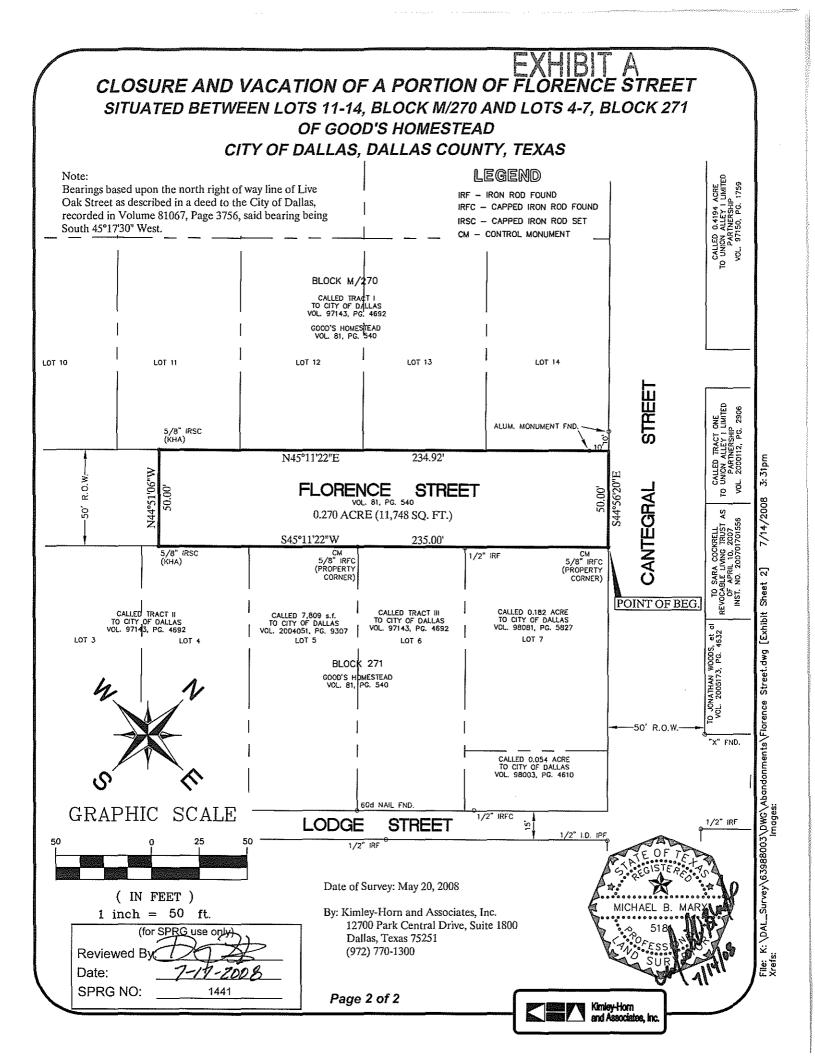

BACKGROUND

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency designated funding to Central States Air Resource Agencies Association to administer a grant that funds the purchase of low emission equipment that generates emergency electrical power. Central States Air Resource Agencies Association (CenSARA), a company located in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, awarded funding to the City of Dallas to install a hydrogen fuel cell to produce emergency power and assist in emergency responses during power outages. The power source uses an uninterruptible power system (UPS), hydrogen fuel cells and a hydrogen storage module with no carbon dioxide (CO2) and nitrous oxide (Nox) emissions to the atmosphere. The emergency power will support the emergency response shelter at Samuell Grand Recreation Center that would be available during a crisis for sheltering individuals and families.

This action will accept grant funds which will be used to purchase the hydrogen fuel cell, uninterrupted power supply and hydrogen storage module.

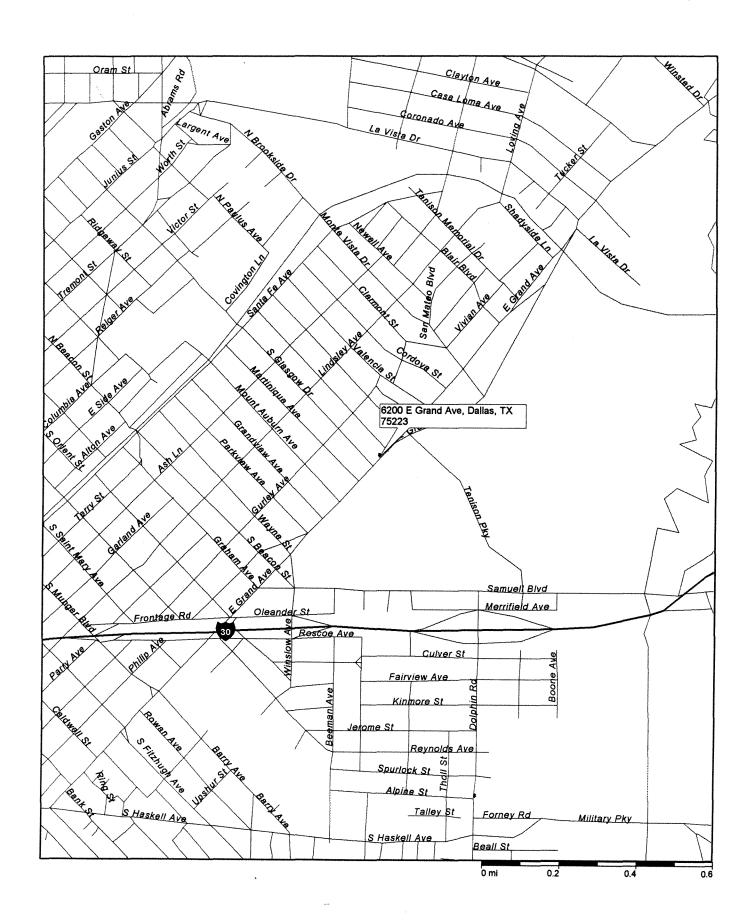

Authorize (1) the acceptance of a grant from the North Central Texas Council of Governments for Sanitation Services to conduct a pilot hotel recycling project; (2) local matching fund contributions; and (3) execution of the grant agreement – Not to exceed \$86,000 – Financing: Texas Commission on Environmental Quality Grant Funds (\$67,722) and Current Funds (\$18,278)

BACKGROUND

On May 16, 2008, Sanitation Services submitted a solid waste implementation project application to the North Central Texas Council of Governments (NCTCOG) to fund a Hotel Recycling Pilot Project for ten (10) months. Hotel recycling is a relatively untapped recycling market. Therefore, the goal of this project is to identify how much recycling is or could be generated in this type of environment; and whether or not such a program is warranted.

Sanitation Services will select two (2) hotels in the Dallas area with at least one hundred-fifty (150) guest rooms and an interest in testing the feasibility of recycling in their hotel. The recyclable waste stream is generated in guests' rooms, administrative offices, conference rooms, as well as public areas of each participating hotel. The list of recyclable materials accepted will include: plastics, glass, cans, assortment of paper and cardboard.

If proven feasible, Sanitation Services will report such findings and recommend means to promote hotel recycling citywide. The promotional campaign will include education, on-site hotel analysis and coordination between hotel management and private waste haulers. Furthermore, the department will maintain monthly statistical data to gauge the success of this program and share with participating hotels.

PRIOR ACTION/REVIEW (COUNCIL, BOARDS, COMMISSIONS)

On January 9, 2008, City Council authorized the City Manager to request project funding under NCTCOG Request for Project Applications of the Regional Solid Waste Local Project Funding Program, by Resolution #08-0158.
