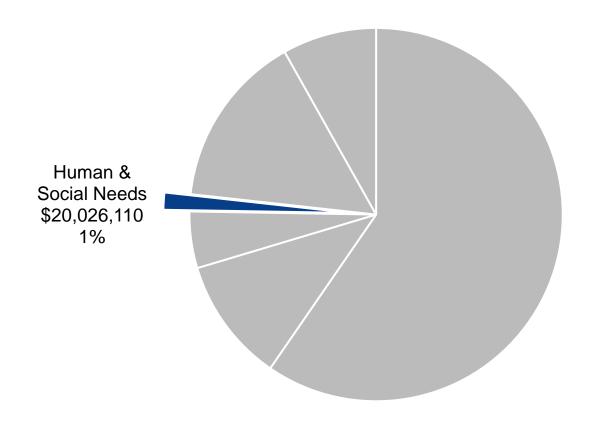

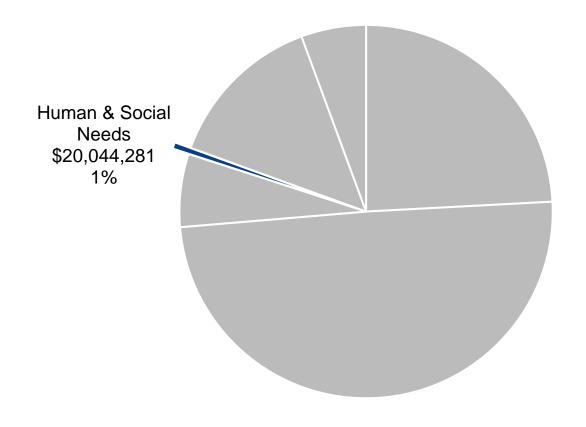

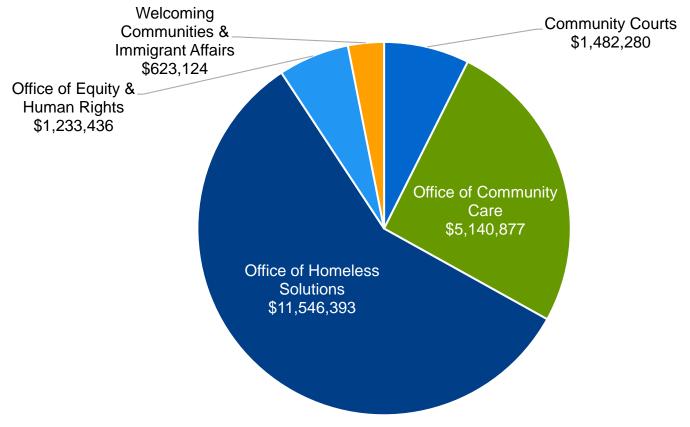

### FY 2018-19 Budget Highlights

- Addressing homelessness holistically, including \$2.3M for:
  - Strengthening homeless response systems
  - Providing improved supportive housing for chronically homeless seniors
  - Leveraging "shovel-ready" affordable housing projects
  - Funding a master leasing program
  - Developing a landlord incentive program
- Increasing funding for the End Panhandling Now initiative to \$415K and continuing public education on ways to effectively assist those in need



### FY 2018-19 Budget Highlights

- Committing \$175K to partner with nonprofit organizations to offer civil legal services and promote citizenship to immigrants
- Creating an Office of Equity and Human Rights to promote equity as one of the City's core values and focus on fair housing
- Increasing funding by \$235K for the "Fresh Start" re-entry program to support the transition of formerly incarcerated individuals into the community

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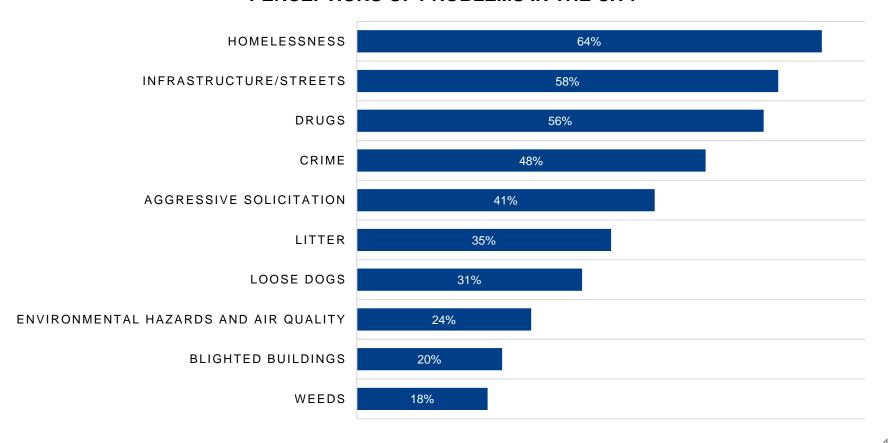

#### PERCEPTIONS OF PROBLEMS IN THE CITY

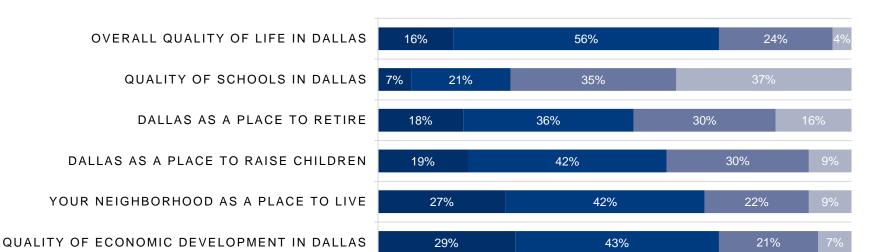

### FY 2017-18 Accomplishments

- Welcoming Communities and Immigrant Affairs
  - Conducted 280 community engagements, reaching an estimated 16,433 Dallas residents
  - Established the #MyDallas Citizenship Campaign, involving hundreds of Dallas residents and helping hundreds of immigrants to become U.S. citizens
- Office of Homeless Solutions
  - Increased Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) participation from 30% to 66%, meeting HUD minimum requirements
  - Addressed 86% of encampment service requests within 30 days
  - 766 households received supportive housing



### FY 2017-18 Accomplishments

- Office of Community Care
  - 74 formerly homeless individuals and families received case management support and maintained stable housing through the Fresh Start program
- Community Courts & Community Prosecution
  - Helped 523 individuals with job placement and training, housing, basic life skills, substance abuse and mental health treatment, ELL/GED, and coding classes
  - Assisted 12 veterans through the recently reopened Veteran's Treatment Court
