

# **Background/History**

- On August 12, 2015, City Council approved a three-year service contract for street sweeping services (Resolution No. 15-1337)
- To continue street sweeping services, bids were solicited for a three-year price agreement with the lowest bidders being:
  - Mister Sweeper LP
  - KAT Klean, Inc.



# **Background/History**

- On August 20, 2018, item was considered by the GPFM Committee
- On August 22, 2018, City Council considered the three-year price agreement
  - Council did not approve the item but requested further discussion in GPFM Committee on the need for street sweeping



# **Purposes of Street Sweeping**

- Council approval of this item is essential to continue delivery of street sweeping services outside of the Central Business District
- Street sweeping is necessary to comply with the mandated requirements set forth in the City's MS4 Permit issued through TCEQ
- Best practice in operating an efficient storm water sewer system



# **Purposes of Street Sweeping**

- Keeps community/streets aesthetically pleasing
- As street sweeping is completed on major thoroughfares, removes debris from bike lanes
- Removes debris that could potentially damage cars and nails/screws that could puncture tires



# **Operational Impact**

- Approximately 2,220 gutter miles of sweeping is completed every 30 days
- Annual average of 1,800 tons debris removal over last 3 years

# **Proposed Action**

- Council approval is needed to continue street sweeping services
- Contractual street sweeping services are necessary to comply with mandated requirements and desired outcomes associated with street sweeping
- Not approving the recommended price agreement would result in a reduction of street sweeping services



# **Staff Recommendation**

- Staff recommends the Government Performance and Financial Management Committee forward the following to City Council for consideration and approval of:
  - A three-year service price agreement for street sweeping services not to exceed \$3,717,816.22
    - Mister Sweeper LP: \$3,617.246.22
    - KAT Klean, Inc.: \$100,570.00
