

  - Receive approx. 200,000 citations annually














#### Citation Counts and Gen. Fund Collection Per Citation





\*all cases higher than a Misdemeanor "C" municipal violation




#### Marshal's Warrant Enforcement



# **Lew Sterrett Jail Contract Responsibilities**

# CTS' Oversight of the City's Jail Contract

- Original agreement signed in 1978; amended four times since then
- FY16's budget is \$7,557,391; FY17's proposed is \$7,812,862
- Brought before Council annually in September
- The City of Dallas is charged for three items
  - Prorated operational costs
  - Per prisoner intake costs (Class C only and Class C with higher charges)
  - Per prisoner housing costs (Class C only)
