## Background

- July 24, 2012 - De-escalation training for patrol officers began following an Officer Involved Shooting within the Dixon Circle community. Other directives from the incident included:
- Concurrent investigative review with the FBI Civil Rights Office
- Mandatory carry for Taser trained officers
- Enhanced consensual search policy requiring written and/or recorded consent
- Creation of the Community Engagement Team
- Implementation of a comprehensive Response to Resistance (Use of Force) reporting system
- January 2013 - DPD began use of Blue Team reporting application for Response to Resistance data


## White House

## Open Data Initiative

- November 2014 - DPD released 12 years of Officer Involved Shooting data online
- December 2014 - President Obama announced creation of $21^{\text {st }}$ Century Policing Task Force
- March 2015 - task force submitted interim report with 60 recommendations
- One recommendation placed significant emphasis on the potential of data and technology to improve policing outcomes and community trust
- April 2015 - White House hosted a Police Open Data. DPD was recognized as a forerunner in providing innovative solutions, bringing transparency and context to the complexities of policing.
- April 2016 - DPD released 3 years of comprehensive Response to Resistance data online

## Blue Team Reporting System

## Purpose of Blue Team

- Captures detailed statistical information of response to resistance incidents not included in regular offense reporting system.
- Allows front line personnel to enter information quickly into a review process.
- Allows officers to stay in field while entering required information.
- Increase transparency efforts to improve citizen's trust of officers' actions.


## Blue Team Report Types

## First Line Level - Police Officer

- Response to Resistance (Use of Force)
- Consent \& Non-Consent Search
- Foot Pursuit


## Supervisor Level - Sergeant and Above

- Vehicle Pursuit
- Commendations / Summary Discipline
- Probation Failure
- Lost/Damaged City Property
- Division Referral Investigation
- Upload Video (Body Camera / DVR)
- Photos


## Summary

- Builds trust
- Protects officers
- Protects citizens
- Improves accountability
- Reduces litigations
- Ongoing effort to merge with Records Management System (RMS) to reduce duplication of data collection
