

# EMS Off-line Medical Direction Contract: Legal Requirements

- Required for an EMS agency by Texas Administrative Code, Title 25, Part
   1, Chapter 157
- Off-line medical direction role defined in Texas Administrative Code, Title 22, Part 9, Chapter 197, § Rule 197.3
- Primary responsibilities by rule:
  - Actively involved in:
    - Initial and on-going training
    - Quality Management activities
    - Mass Casualty Incident (MCI) planning
    - Dispatch and communication operations
  - Approval of the level of pre-hospital care provided
  - Develop, implement and revise protocols and standing orders for all components

# UTSW/BioTel Medical Direction (Off-line)



- Established in the mid-1970s
- Services provided under the Emergency Medicine Division at the University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center (UTSW)
- UTSW Emergency Medicine Division Chair: Dr. Deborah Diercks
- UTSW/Biotel Medical Direction System Team Medical Director: Dr. S. Marshal Isaacs
- Team of 13 emergency medicine physicians
- 14 Dallas County fire-based EMS agencies banded together under common medical direction

# Off-line Medical Direction: Contract

- Services provided to DFR through a contract with UTSW
- Dallas Fire-Rescue Medical Director:
   Dr. S. Marshal Isaacs
- Per contract:
  - 24 hours per week in EMS office
  - Additional services provided outside business hours 4 hours
- Contract cost: \$234,807

# Mobile Community Healthcare Program Contract: Children's Hospital

- Original contract executed August 25, 2015 –
   Resolution 15-477
- Reassignment of existing contract with Children's Hospital
  - Originally assigned to the Physicians for Children DBA "Children's Health Pediatric Group" (CHPG)
  - New assignment to Children's Healthcare System of Texas (CHST)
- Allows for larger pool from which to enroll patients
- No monetary change to primary contract

# Mobile Community Healthcare Program Contract: MedStar

- On the September 14, 2016 Council Agenda
- Expansion of regional program for hospice patients
- Based on per-member-per-month enrollment fee
- Designed to assist the hospice patient and their family
- Designed to prevent unnecessary revocation of hospice program
- Estimated revenue generation: \$100,000

# Mobile Community Healthcare Program Contract: UTSW

- Allows MCHP paramedics access into the UTSW EPIC medical record system
- Supports two existing MCHP contracts with UTSW
- Allows confidential, HIPAA compliant transfer of protected health information to support program and patient goals
- No cost consideration

# Mobile Community Healthcare Program Contract: THR/Presbyterian

- New contract for MCHP services
- Will provide out-of-hospital care coordination services for enrolled THR/Presbyterian patients
- Estimated revenue: \$100,000

# Enhanced Emergency Medical Dispatch

Public Safety Committee September 12, 2016







- Emergency Medical Dispatch Software
  - > Facilitates provision of medical instruction to 911 callers over the phone
  - > Standardizes instruction via use of scripted protocols
  - > Ensures a high level of caller engagement and customer service
  - ➤ Medical instruction protocols are used globally with design intended to ensure the highest probability of successful outcome
  - New software helps dispatch appropriate EMS resource based on call type

### Cont'd


- >A more robust Quality assurance program-911 Caller customer Service
- > Medical protocols suggest dispatch of appropriate resources
- > All medical emergencies received entail dispatch of resources
- ➤ High priority EMS calls (Heart attacks, shootings, stabbings) receive immediate dispatch of an Ambulance
- > Reporting capabilities

### Cont'd


- Lower priority EMS calls may be served by fire fleet units (Engines, Trucks, SUVs, Community Paramedics, etc.) staffed with highly trained paramedics
- ➤ New EMS deployment model will enhance DFR's capacity to provide medical service delivery in a more timely manner with the most appropriate resource
- ➤ Hot summer months result in high 911 call volume and new software will help address delayed response due to limited resources

- Cont'd
  - >911 Call volume continues to strain EMS resources (Peak months-Summer)
  - Local media headline: "Concerns about paramedic, ambulance shortages as 911 calls up in Dallas"





### 17.9% increase (EMS Dispatch of Resources) FY 12-FY 16 (1st 10 months of FY)



### **Software Procurement Efforts**

- DFR engaged services of consultant Fitch and Associates (Fitch) to undertake a comprehensive study of DFR's EMS system and to assist with development of specifications to purchase EMS dispatch software (Sept. 24, 2014)
- Fitch conducted extensive study of DFR's and the COD 911 system. Work included focus group meetings, technology system and workflow design, and Computer Aided Dispatch historical data analysis to help develop specifications.
- DFR, Fitch, and COD Procurement have worked collaboratively on this project. DFR expects contract to purchase software will go to council for approval on September 28, 2016, Council Agenda.

# Software Implementation Components

- Purchased software will entail extensive training with dispatchers and field personnel (roles and responsibilities)
- Quality assurance officers will be identified and trained
- A high level of engagement between DFR EMS/Dispatch, Software Vendor and other stakeholders will be required to chart implementation schedule
- DFR will undertake a public media campaign to educate public on the new EMS delivery model (i.e., Twitter, Facebook, City and DFR PIOs, local media, etc.)
- DFR anticipates "Go Live" with use of software during early summer 2017.

    - Operates on wildland engines to deploy wildland fire fighting tactics and structure protection.
    - Every member is on the Strike Team.
  - Wildland Hand Crew (One of only two municipal teams in Texas)
    - A highly specialized team that can remain self-sufficient for up to 72 hours in remote areas while wildland firefighting.








# Wildland Fire Emergency Why Now?










City of Dallas

# What is a Community Wildfire Protection Plan (CWPP)?

 A CWPP identifies how Dallas Fire-Rescue and our partners will mitigate against, prepare for and respond to wildfires and disasters






# Why Should DFR Have a CWPP?

- Suppression of historic low-intensity naturallyoccurring wildfires has caused a buildup of wildland fuels in WUI's
- Dallas has critical WUI areas (Examples)
  - Trinity River Forest (the largest urban hardwood forest in the United States)
  - Cedar Ridge Preserve/Mountain Creek area
  - Lake Ray Hubbard

 The Great Trinity Forest and River cuts through a dense urban core of 1.2 million residents as it flows towards the Gulf of Mexico

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

# An example of the hard copy map for Crawford Memorial Park



## It helps get us where we need to go!


- The City of Dallas street file is called "Dalroads". Dalroads is:
  - Maintained by the Dallas Water Utilities Enterprise GIS Division
  - The authoritative source for City of Dallas street information
  - Full of detailed information for every segment of every street.
  - Used by 9-1-1 CAD system for selecting the closest unit to respond to an incident
  - Used for by 9-1-1 CAD system for routing Police, Fire and EMS to emergency incidents
  - Updated frequently with the latest information (change is constant).
  - Updates are pushed out to all Police and Fire Mobile Data Computers
  - Absolutely critical for both DPD and DFR
  - Is also used by many other city departments.









## Relationship with a primary stakeholder - Dallas Water Utilities Enterprise GIS Division:

- DFR GIS works closely with DWU Enterprise GIS on many projects related to streets, addressing, apartments and other issues.
- DWU provides office space for two DFR GIS Analysts.
- DWU is currently working with us on an apartment mapping project.
- DWU leveraged their relationship with ESRI (GIS system vendor) to send 3 DFR members to ESRI training. This resulted in a savings of \$4800 for the City of Dallas (specifically from DFR's budget).

## DFR GIS, DWU Enterprise GIS, and Fire Hydrants

- DFR GIS is the liaison between the Dallas Water Utilities Department (DWU) which installs the fire hydrants and Dallas Fire-Rescue Emergency Response Bureau which maintains them.
- In this role, DFR GIS worked with our programmer to develop a new database that efficiently manages the entire program and also interfaces with DWU's SAP database.



- Investing in GIS is smart business. GIS produces a significant return on investment.
- When data is removed from silos and made widely available to all members of the department, duplication of effort is reduced.

Upcoming Agenda Item 29: Authorize (1) acceptance of additional grant funds from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security through the Texas Department of Public Safety under the Homeland Security Grant Program for the 2014 State Homeland Security Program in the amount of \$215,356 to provide funding for equipment acquisition, planning and training activities to enable the City to respond to natural and man-made disasters; (2) extension of the performance period for the 2014 Homeland Security Program from September 1, 2014 to January 31, 2016 to September 1, 2014 to July 31, 2016; (3) an increase in appropriations in the amount of \$215,356 in the 2014 State Homeland Security Program Fund; and (4) execution of the grant agreement -Not to exceed \$215,356, from \$5,912,175 to \$6,127,531

In response to the July 7, 2016 protest incident, the State of Texas Administrative Agency (via the Department of Homeland Security), proposed a reallocation of remaining 2014 State Homeland Security Grant Program (SHSP) to be awarded to the City of Dallas to meet immediate equipment needs for the Dallas Police Department. This would allow for a small extension to the grant performance period to allow the purchasing and receipt of the requested equipment. The initial reallocated award total was for \$215,355.54. However, we were only able to expend \$212,585.00 and sent the remaining \$2,770.54 back to the State.

The Office of Emergency Management is seeking the support and recommendation from the Public Safety Committee to authorize the acceptance of the additional grant funds. This item will be placed on the September 14, 2016, City Council Agenda.
