CM Kingston supports this idea and would like staff to continue to seek interest from retirees. MPT Caraway's concerns are with the hires not getting paid for vacation or holidays and not being able to accrue sick time. Chair McGough would like to see about adding responding to priority 3 and 4 calls to the list of capacities; staff will look into it. CM Felder would like to see about using this as an opportunity to address the response time for property crimes.

3. <u>Nuisance Abatement Ordinance Review</u> Presenter(s): Major Melissa McGee, DPD Information Only:

Action Taken/Committee Recommendation(s):

This briefing provided the committee with a draft view of the Nuisance Abatement Ordinance and performance measures that have been put in place. CM Greyson would like to see if it's possible to mandate that the owner attend the accord meetings and not a representative; staff will look into it. CM Felder continues to express his concerns with the amount of crime in his district and is requesting another camera trailer to be deployed. He would like to know how much it would cost to get another camera trailer added to the fleet. Vacant lots continue to be used for loitering (drinking, gambling, etc.) and CM Felder wants to see what the CAO can do to enforce the Criminal Trespass Affidavit (CTA) Program in order for DPD to go onto private property. The CAO will report back.

MPT Caraway reported a nuisance at/near the Buck and Ruck on MLK Jr. Blvd. where at the foot of the bridge, on the parking lot, there are groups of 25-50 people hanging out with their barbeque pits, etc.; a burglary also happened at Buck and Ruck last week. He would like to see this ordinance enforced at this location and it broken up. DMPT Medrano would like to get a list of the hot spots staff currently has. The CAO mentioned that a representative from the National Convenience Store Association will be speaking to the Risk Teams tomorrow about best practices and crime prevention. Chair McGough would like the agenda for this meeting be sent to the Committee. He also mentioned that having a year is long enough to close a case and reduce abatable offenses 100% instead of by 50%.

The Nuisance Abatement Ordinance is tentatively scheduled to brief Full Council on December 6, 2017.
