Action Taken/Committee Recommendation(s): The Dallas Animal Services (DAS) branch of the Code Compliance department provided the committee with an update on the progress of the services initiatives.

CM Young: requested an update on whether or not staff had contacted other neighboring shelters and nonprofits with regard to vacancies for strays found in Dallas. She also requested reaching out to find grants and other funding sources to aid with handling strays.

CM Clayton: requested that recommendations made by consultant be prioritized and that the appropriate funds are allocated in order to execute those recommendations. In addition, he has requested that one person be dedicated to the messaging for Dallas Animals Services. He is concerned with the issue of maintaining continuity with regard to messaging campaigns done by DAS.

CM McGough: Requested the cost breakdown of working with the CIS partnered consultant. In addition, he requested a list of all calls relating to animals and accompanying data on the priority ranking of those calls. He also requested specification on the meaning of "gradual reduction over time." He also requested that data on the intake of strays be converted from percentages to a total whole number.

CM Callahan: suggested DAS should simplify their outreach campaign and ensure that it reaches a wide range of audiences in Dallas

CM Kingston: Requested that staff focus on sustainability of the program and lowering the number of residents who are unaware of the DAS services.
