SUBJECT Quarterly Transportation Grant Report

The City of Dallas has submitted three (3) transportation grants under one (1) federal program:

Transportation Investment Generating Economic Recovery Discretionary Grant Program (TIGER)

The Transportation Investment Generating Economic Recovery, or TIGER Discretionary Grant program, provides a unique opportunity for the U.S. Department of Transportation to invest in road, rail, transit and port projects that promise to achieve critical national objectives. The City of Dallas submitted three (3) projects under the call for TIGER grants. The Northaven Bridge and LBJ/Skillman Interchange projects were submitted by the City of Dallas directly. The Vickery Meadows/Park Lane Complete Street was submitted by the North Texas Central Council of Governments.

The TIGER program is highly competitive, and a total of 627 applications were submitted nationwide for a total of \$10 billion. Only 39 projects were selected for funding, and of those, only one project was funded in Texas for buses in rural areas. 43% of awards were to rural areas.

The City of Dallas has previously been successful in securing \$25 million in TIGER funding under the American Reinvestment and Recovery Act for the downtown streetcar extension into North Oak Cliff.
