## **SUBJECT Ad Hoc Committee on Legislative Affairs Update**

On Tuesday, August 2, the Ad Hoc Committee on Legislative Affairs was briefed on government and legislative relations. The Committee began initial considerations of the legislative priorities for the upcoming 88<sup>th</sup> Texas Legislature and 118<sup>th</sup> Congress, which may be advanced in the City's final adopted program for 2023. The final legislative programs for the City Council review will be prioritized in context of current affairs and additional considerations which may impact the viability of a particular item reaching a successful conclusion during the legislative session.

The legislative team is communicating with external stakeholders regarding potential program considerations to ensure partners have an opportunity to submit input. It is anticipated that following the City Council adoption of the state and federal legislative priorities, final materials will be posted on the Government Affairs website <a href="here">here</a>.

Following are responses to inquiries received during the August 2<sup>nd</sup> legislative committee meeting:

- **City of Dallas Grants** Please find attached a chart outlining City of Dallas grant programs regularly applied for and received at the state and federal levels, aligned with legislative priority areas. These programs may be considered for legislative activity to maintain the funding stream or secure additional funding.
- DPD/School District Outreach As noted during the committee meeting, DPD hosted its first active shooter joint-exercise with Dallas ISD, DPD School Resource Officers assigned to Richardson ISD and Dallas Fire-Rescue on Tuesday, July 27. DPD will host similar exercises with every school district in the City of Dallas. DPD has reached out to multiple districts/police departments including Plano, Carrollton-Farmers Branch, Duncanville, Grand Prairie, and Mesquite to begin planning these threat exercises.
- Organizational memberships The Office of Government Affairs staff is preparing administrative actions for renewal of the following memberships and programs in anticipation of the City Council's approval of the FY23 budget:
