SUBJECT Community Development Block Grant – Disaster Recovery Funds

On December 14, City Council approved final adoption of the Community Development Block Grant – Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) budget in the amount of \$24,433,000. As a reminder, the City of Dallas received a direct allocation of CDBG-DR funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) due to the February 2021 winter weather storm. Prior to submitting the City Council's approved budget to HUD on December 28, staff learned that an additional allocation of CDBG-DR funds would potentially be directed to the City. We held our submission pending notification of additional funds, and on January 18, HUD distributed an Allocation Amendment Notice increasing the amount of CDBG-DR funds to the City by \$15,967,000.

The City's amended CDBG-DR budget covering the full allocation of \$40,400,000 is now due to HUD by May 18. Budget & Management Services' (BMS) staff is in the process of developing an amended budget in coordination with Housing and Neighborhood Revitalization and the Office of Emergency Management. Staff will present the City Manager's recommendation to the Community Development Commission (CDC) on March 2 before bringing the budget to the City Council for preliminary approval on March 8. A public hearing and final adoption are planned for April 12.

As a reminder, eligible use of funds by category includes disaster recovery, restoration of infrastructure, housing, economic revitalization, and mitigation. Each funded activity must be a CDBG eligible activity (principally benefit low- and moderate-income persons) and address most impacted and distressed (MID) areas. The entire City is in a MID so there are no restrictions on location. Funds may only be used for unmet disaster recovery or mitigation needs not addressed by other resources.

Follow-up to January 18, 2023 City Council Briefing Meeting: On-Street Parking & Curb Lane Management

The following are responses to questions posed by members of the City Council at the January 18, 2023 City Council Briefing on the On-Street Parking and Curb Management Policy by the Department of Transportation, that required a follow-up response.

1. How many citations were given in the Central Business District (CBD) in 2022 compared to 2021?

Answer: Following City Council's approval of a new parking citation and meter services provider contract on January 25, 2023, staff will work with the vendor to analyze the geospatial citation data to determine the number of citations in the CBD. Across the entire city, however, parking enforcement officers issued 146,056 citations in 2022 and 145,778 citations in 2021.

2. What are the anticipated costs to implement the Policy recommendations?

Answer: Department of Transportation staff are currently inventorying infrastructure and programming needs to estimate the costs for implementation and continued maintenance of the recommended improvements. Staff will have a cost estimate in advance of City Council adoption of the Policy.

3. What fees are required to operate a valet stand?

Answer: Per Section 43-126.6 of the code, there are one-time fees to establish the valet zone and acquire a license, and there are annual fees that must be paid to acquire the license and to renew the license each year thereafter.

- One Time Fees:
 - Application Fee: \$800
 - Fee to install each valet zone sign that Department of Transportation staff determines is needed: \$400
- Annual Fees:
 - If the valet service intends to place a valet stand in the public rightof-way: \$50
 - If the valet service is being conducted within the CBD: \$250 per parking space for the first six spaces, plus \$1,000 for each additional space to be used by the valet service.

 If the valet service is being conducted outside the CBD: \$350 per space for the first two spaces, plus \$1,000 for each additional space to be used by the valet service.

If the valet service is conducted completely on private property, and the public right-of-way is only used for maneuvering vehicles, no annual fee or license is required.

4. What actions is the City taking to enforce valet operations? How are valet operators punished when they park cars on-street?

Answer: When complaints are received, Parking Enforcement Officers will conduct unscheduled visits to meet with valet employees to mitigate any issues and ensure education and compliance. As per City ordinance, operators also can and do receive citations for illegal parking activities like blocking travel lanes or parking on sidewalks. Parking Enforcement Officers also enforce Section 43-126.5 of the code, which states that it is illegal to operate a valet service on public right-of-way without a license or to operate at a time other than the hours and days authorized in the license.

The Director of Transportation may also revoke the license of repeat violators. Per Section 43-126.7(b) of the code, valet parking service licenses shall be revoked if certain criteria are met, including:

- The licensee fails to comply with the requirements of the valet parking service license, Division 3 (Valet Parking Services) of the code, or other applicable laws. This includes "Standards for Operation of a Valet Parking Service" in Section 43-126.9 of the code.
- The Director determines that the operation of the valet parking service endangers the safety of persons or property, or unreasonably interferes with pedestrian or vehicular traffic.

Department of Transportation staff will be looking to expedite research into the best practices for regulating valet services, with the goal of bringing amendments to the Valet Parking Services section of the code to City Council this year.

5. What are the private sector plans to implement electric vehicle charging stations?

Answer: Staff in the Department of Transportation, Office of Environmental Quality & Sustainability, and Department of Public Works reported that, at this time, they are not aware of any private sector plans to, or inquiries about, installing electric vehicle charging stations in the public right-of-way or on City of Dallas property.

The State of Texas Office of the Governor is now accepting applications for the Texas Travel Industry Recovery Grant (TTIR) program for an additional application category: tourism related transportation. The TTIR Program provides one-time grants of up to \$20,000 for the recovery of Texas businesses in the tourism, travel, and hospitality industry that were negatively impacted during the pandemic. SUBJECT Unserved Areas Update

This memorandum serves as a follow-up to the January 18th City Council meeting update on Unserved Areas. The City has been working towards identification and updates to the estimated number of potential septic sewer systems on private property. These estimates are generated through research, as well as reviewing water and wastewater accounts for unbilled wastewater. In 2020, the estimate yielded 457 potential addresses that met these criteria. The 2023 update has identified 453 potential addresses as shown below:

Housing Department staff will continue to develop the homeowner assistance program for connecting private property to the new water and wastewater public infrastructure. This will include an upcoming procurement to secure private plumbing contracts, marketing materials for the residents, and an application and scheduling tool. As this program is developed, staff will work with your offices to help reach residents to educate and encourage participation in the program. Future updates on this program are anticipated to be available in late Spring 2023.

SUBJECT ARPA Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Funding for City Council Districts

Along with review and passage of the FY 2021-22 budget in September 2021, the City Council finalized decisions regarding the allocation of \$355.4 million ARPA Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (CLFRF). The ARPA budget approved by the City Council includes \$16 million to provide for specific needs identified by City Council Members and the Mayor. The budget allocation includes \$1 million for each City Council Member and \$2 million for the Mayor to determine the specific use.

Staff has reached out to City Council Members, discussed potential uses, researched eligibility of activities, responded to requests for information, and tried to assist City Council Members in identifying the activities that each City Council Member wants to implement within their district. Prior communication was provided on the following dates and is linked to this memo: May 13, 2022, July 15, 2022, and October 14, 2022.

Attached is a spreadsheet that identifies activities and specific amounts allocated by City Council Members and the Mayor. These activities and allocations are considered final unless you notify us right away of any changes. The spreadsheet also identifies other activities with the allocation indicated as "TBD". We are still awaiting final decisions by City Council Members for the allocation of the remaining funds.

We are approaching a critical point in the timeline to use these funds and need your assistance to move activities forward. Please submit your final decisions for your remaining funds no later than Tuesday, February 28, 2023.

Federal rules require that program and services using ARPA/CLFRF funds go through a competitive solicitation process and cannot be direct awards. In addition to time needed to complete the solicitation process and deliver a program, some projects such as infrastructure projects will require even more time to complete. The deadline to encumber ARPA funds through a competitive solicitation process is September 30, 2024. All encumbered funds must be spent by September 30, 2026.

To ensure all funds are utilized in a timely manner, <u>we recommend that unallocated funds be reprogrammed to address other high priority citywide initiatives</u>. We will consider reprogramming of ARPA funds through our FY 2022-23 mid-year budget process with recommendations to GPFM on April 24, 2023 and to the City Council in May 2023.

ARPA Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Funding for City Council Districts

As a reminder, activities in qualified census tracts or to serve individuals/communities that were disproportionally affected by the pandemic provide more flexibility and generally include more eligible use categories. Staff is available to assist and work with you to facilitate the allocation of your remaining funds.

OHS Street Outreach Update

The Dallas Real Time Rapid Rehousing (D.R.T.R.R.) team of homeless service providers, co-led by the Office of Homeless Solutions (OHS) and Metro Dallas Homeless Alliance (MDHA), is currently targeting several encampments, which will result in closure through the housing of those unsheltered individuals throughout the year. The team will outreach to these sites and meet with various persons experiencing homelessness to assess their needs in preparation for site closure via housing. During this time, the OHS Street Outreach Team will continue to engage

with unsheltered residents through normal street outreach, connecting people with the needed resources, such as: getting IDs, working with Community Courts on expunging eligible tickets and offenses from their records, identifying medical needs, and getting them access to the Coordinated Access System (CAS). The DRTRR Community Dashboard is live and may be found here.


