In 2012 Dallas County solicited applications from cities for transportation infrastructure partnership projects to be funded through the Sixth Call of the Dallas County Major Capital Improvement Program (MCIP). The MCIP is a partnership "Funding Commitment" financing mechanism for the County to provide half of the total project cost for transportation infrastructure improvements. Through this program, approximately \$40 million dollars will be available annually in FY 2017 through FY 2020.

SUBJECT City of Dallas Continuity of Operations Plan Update

The Office of Emergency Management (OEM) has selected a contractor to assist in updating the citywide Continuity of Operation Plan (COOP). This plan is an effort to assure the capability exists to continue essential agency functions across a wide range of potential emergencies. The updated COOP plan will fulfill all of the findings cited in City Audit report A13-009.

The objectives of the COOP plan include:

- a) Ensuring the continuous performance of an agency's essential functions/operations during an emergency;
- b) Protecting essential facilities, equipment, records (paper and electronic), and other assets;
- c) Reducing or mitigating disruptions to operations;
- d) Reducing loss of life, minimizing damage and losses; and,
- e) Achieving a timely and orderly recovery from an emergency and resumption of full service to customers.

The updated City COOP plan will consist of a Basic Plan which is an overview of how COOP works within the organization and annexes which will describe COOP operations for each department. The Office of Emergency Management will work with each Department Director to identify staff to serve on the Citywide COOP planning team. This team will consist of staff that are well-informed about their department's daily operation and critical functions.

The contract for the updated citywide COOP plan is scheduled on the October 8th council agenda with updates beginning upon contract execution. The City will be using Homeland Security Grant Funding for this project. The COOP project is expected to be fully developed and tested within one year of the contract date.
