Encampment Resolution Schedule - November 26, 2019 & December 3, 2019

OHS Street Outreach team will continue to engage with homeless individuals to provide notice of clean-up and connect to resources and shelter. New items

Road Closure & City Hall Power Interruption

There will be a road closure ahead of a planned power interruption. The road will be temporarily used to house a power generator during the power interruption. The U-turn lane from the east parking garage exit to S. Ervay Street will be closed on Monday, November 25, 2019 through Sunday, December 1, 2019. The lane is expected to reopen on Monday, December 2. During this time, Browder Street will remain open as well as the main exit on Young Street.

Please note the removal and replacement of the main power distribution panels at Dallas City Hall will begin after hours on Wednesday, November 27 to Sunday, December 1, 2019. No power will be available for daily operations at City Hall. If you are scheduled to

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work, your supervisor will have additional instructions. Critical Infrastructure including 911 (Dallas Police Department), Dallas Fire Rescue, Dallas 311, Office of Emergency Management and IT Services will not be affected. Bulk and Brush Collection Update

As of Tuesday, November 26th, all Bulk and Brush Collections have returned to "on schedule" status. Crews are now collecting in Week 4 areas, the current scheduled week. Week 4 collections should be complete by Saturday, November 30th, so that Week 1 collections begin on schedule, Monday, December 2nd. Following the October 20, 2019 tornado, bulk and brush collections were suspended in order to deploy strike teams to the disaster affected areas. Sanitation crews along with up to 20 contractors have been working 6-7 days per week in an effort to return to normal schedule. MCC Security Digital Desk Sign-in: Vendor Acknowledgement

Effective November 2019, the digital sign-in at the MCC security desk includes a requirement for guests to report if they have a pending bid or proposal for a contract with the City. The change is being implemented in partnership with the Office of Procurement Services as part of the City's enhanced efforts to ensure transparency and compliance throughout the procurement process. Fall 2019 Operation Beautification Event

The Fall 2019 Operation Beautification Event took place on Saturday, November 2, 2019. Leading up to the event, due to the tornado in North Dallas on October 20, 2019, active recruitment and registration was suspended to enable City services to focus on the affected areas. Registered groups were contacted and made aware of anticipated trash pick-up delays and asked to consider discarding collected debris/trash themselves or cancelling their events. We are happy to announce that of the 47 registered groups, 23 opted to continue with their neighborhood cleanup events while contributing to the City's tornado response by discarding collected trash themselves. Inquiry: Dallas Morning News had a follow up question regarding the number of dog breeds being picked up by the department and the progress using the Dallas90 Shelter Service System. They provided a <u>link</u> to a story that mentioned Dallas90 efforts. The Dallas90 Service System is sill in the development stage with a proposed 2020 launch date. DAS explained how complex the breed number breakdown is because visual dog breed identification is proven to be unreliable. The most reliable generalizations DAS can make are related to dog size. DAS was able to provide data related to dog size.

Dallas Fire-Rescue Department Media Requests: November 18th – November 24th, 2019.

<u>Tuesday, November 19th</u>: WFAA 8 (from City PAO, Anastasia Reed) - Below are the questions I received from the WFAA reporter who's doing a story on firefighters with cancer. I drafted responses for 2 and 4, but they may need to be reviewed. Jason, can you make sure 5 is accurate or provide a more accurate response? I'd like to have these back to the reporter by 5 p.m. today.

- 1. What is the process for workers comp in the city of Dallas if a firefighter is diagnosed with cancer?
- Was the city in support of Senate Bill 2551 this past year, where firefighters and EMT's in Texas can get worker's compensation if diagnosed with a specific type of cancer – 11 listed? The City of Dallas follows all laws set forth by State and Federal levels.
- 3. How many firefighters have applied for worker's comp because of cancer? How many have been granted and denied?
- 4. How much has the city spent on worker's comp for firefighters with cancer?
- 5. Overall comment on the situation of firefighters getting cancer? I know the city is investing in a 2nd set of gear to help firefighters! The City's FY 2019-2020 budget invests heavily in public safety and first responders. This budget will allow the City to purchase a second set of personal protective equipment and a complete replacement of self-contained breathing apparatus for firefighters. Dallas Fire-Rescue continuously evaluates protective gear to ensure our firefighters are safe.

<u>City Response</u> – The following joint response was sent, on Wednesday 11/20, after review by the CAO:

QUESTION 1: What is the process for workers comp in the City of Dallas if a firefighter is diagnosed with cancer?

The workers' compensation process is the same for all City employees who claim to have a work-related injury or illness:

- Once a City employee notifies his direct supervisor, superior or a workers' compensation coordinator, the injury/illness claim is reported to the City's third-party administrator (TPA) Tristar.
- Tristar completes and submits a DWC 001 form to the State.

- Workers' Compensation Coordinator contacts the employee within 24-hours of notice to provide and discuss a selection of a treating doctor from the City's workers' compensation health care network provided by Injury Management Organization (IMO). This may include an out-of-network approval process if the employee sought medical treatment prior to notifying the City.
- TRISTAR has 60 days to determine if the claim is compensable.
 Employee would receive medical treatment during these 60 days.

QUESTION 2: Was the City in support of Senate Bill 2551 this past year, where firefighters and EMT's in Texas can get worker's compensation if diagnosed with a specific type of cancer – 11 listed?

Still working on finding additional information for this question.

QUESTION 3: How many firefighters have applied for worker's comp because of cancer? How many have been granted and denied?

55 cancer claims filed 12 cancer claims accepted 43 cancer claims denied

QUESTION 4: How much has the city spent on worker's comp for firefighters with cancer?

\$2,609,989.14

QUESTION 5: Overall comment on the situation of firefighters getting cancer? I know the city is investing in a 2nd set of gear to help firefighters!

Since 2005, when the Texas Legislature adopted the presumptive cancer law, Dallas Fire-Rescue has had several members who have died from cancer recognized as Line of Duty Deaths, but we know the impact is much larger.

DFR has dedicated a number of departmental resources toward cancer prevention and supporting those who've been diagnosed. Everything from wellness exams (before and during employment), to workers compensation, to counseling support of firefighters and their families, to additional equipment and procedural changes have been made in an effort to reduce exposure to cancer causing agents as well as the recurrence of this deadly disease.

Going forward, the department has plans to change its firefighting gear to types that filter out hazardous particles and keeps the particles from getting onto the firefighters' skin. Additionally, we have employed gross decontamination procedures that all members undergo after fighting fires. Extractors (large washing machines for firefighting gear) are located throughout the department to clean firefighting gear, in addition to regular washing machines used to clear their duty uniforms while at the station. We also provide professional cleaning and inspection of firefighting gear; and using funds from the City's FY 2019-2020 budget, we will buy each firefighter a second set of firefighting gear so that they can change into "clean" gear after every fire and send the dirty set out for cleaning.

<u>NOTE</u>: The responses are to be used in the second part of a long-form piece WFAA 8 if doing on the prevalence of cancer in the fire service. Part 1 aired on Friday, November 1st, and Part 2 is scheduled to air on Friday, November 22nd.

<u>Tuesday, November 19th</u>: Dallas Morning News (Sarah Blaskovich) - I'm hearing there was a 3- or 4-alarm fire at Town Hearth, a steakhouse in the Design District, tonight. The address is 1617 Market Center Blvd, Dallas, TX 75207. What can you tell me about the fire? Were there any injuries? What was the cause of the fire? What was the damage?

I'll take information as soon as you're able to get it.

<u>City Response</u> - On Tuesday, November 19th, at 18:19, Dallas Fire-Rescue units were assigned to a 911 call for a structure fire at the Town Hearth restaurant, located at 1617 Market Center Boulevard, in the Dallas Design District.

When firefighters arrived at the location there was a light smoke throughout the restaurant, and all occupants (customers and workers) had evacuated. The went into the kitchen to find the remnants of a kitchen fire that made its way into the overhead cooking ventilation system. They were able to make quick work of what the fire suppression system didn't extinguish on its own, and declare the fire extinguished with 30 minutes.

According to investigators, people working in the kitchen stated that the fire began on a grill and quickly made its way into the overhead cooking ventilation system where it continued to spread through the length of the system before making its way to ventilation exit at the roof of the restaurant.

The fire resulted in no structural damage to the restaurant and was isolated to the ventilation system.

Wednesday, November 20th: NBC 5/Telemundo (Cynthia Garcia) -

I hope this email finds you well. We would like to do a story on First Responders spending Thanksgiving at the fire house. What do they do? Who prepares the food and what they are thankful for?

Can you help me with this? English and Spanish interviews would be great.

Thank you for your attention to this matter and I look forward to hearing from you soon.

<u>City Response</u> – After consulting with the Station, I arranged for them to visit Fire Station 18 on Thanksgiving Day.

<u>Thursday, November 21st</u>: NBC 5/Telemundo (Karen Ballesteros) - Do you have any information on the fire at Wood Valley and Crocker Hill? We know police is currently on scene talking to the family affected on this fire.

<u>City Response</u> - At <u>14:22</u> Dallas Fire-Rescue responded to a 911 call for a 1-Alarm structure fire at a home located, on the 2500 block of Wood Valley Drive, in near the intersection of W. Illinois Avenue and S. Cockrell Hill Road.

When firefighters arrived at the one-story residence there was smoke coming from the roof of the home.

Firefighters moved in for an offensive fire attack and found fire in the attached garage, which had already gotten into the attic space and begun to spread laterally. Despite the advanced stages of the fire, attack teams were able to quickly knock the flames down and declare the fire extinguished in under half an hour.

There were two people, a woman and her daughter, in the house when the fire began, but they were both able to make it out safely.

Investigators were able to determine that the fire was accidental in nature, and most probably the cause of improperly discarded smoking materials left inside the garage, where another occupant (the Son), who had recently left from the garage, was known to go for a smoke.

<u>Friday, November 22nd</u>: WFAA 8 (Alyssa Woulfe) and KRLD (Austin York) - Anything noteworthy about the reported fire at The Anatole Hotel?

<u>City Response</u> - According to on-scene personnel, there was a small fire in a boiler Room located at the back of the hotel. Reportedly the fire had self-extinguished by the time firefighters arrived at the location. Staff at the Anatole went through their normal procedures and begin evacuating the hotel prior to our arrival. There were no injuries reported, the fire was isolated to the boiler Room and units have already begun to clear from the scene.
