Klyde Warren Park AFA (14) – A motion by Bo Slaughter, seconded by Amanda Schulz, to authorize (1) two Advanced Funding Agreements with Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) as follows: (i) on-system and; (ii) on-system maintenance and Amendment No. 1 (TxDOT Agreement No. CSJ 0916-07-034) for the Woodall Rodgers Park Deck Plaza Extension Structure On-System from west of Akard Street to St. Paul Street to provide funding for project costs in the amount of \$7,900,000.00 from Park and Recreation Facilities (B) Fund and assign TxDOT as the project lead to the entire project; and (2) execution of the Advanced Funding Agreements including all terms, conditions, and documents required by the agreements - Total amount of \$7,900,000.00 - Financing: Park and Recreation Facilities (B) Fund (2017 General Obligation Bond Fund), was carried by unanimous vote.

BACKGROUND

Section 42.041(b)(14) of the Texas Human Resources Code, as amended, allows city sponsored youth recreation programs to be exempted from the state's day care licensing laws if the city adopts standards of care for those programs and complies with other requirements of that legislation. One requirement is that the City Council hold a public hearing annually on the city's youth program standards of care and adopt an ordinance re establishing and continuing in effect the standards.

Ordinance No. 23159, adopted by the City Council on June 11, 1997, created Chapter 12 of the Dallas City Code in order to exempt City of Dallas youth programs from State child care licensing requirements and provide minimum standards by which the City operates youth programs. 





Authorize approval of the revised Golf Course Operations Policy – Financing: No cost consideration to the City

BACKGROUND

The Park and Recreation Board approves the Golf Course Operations Policy, which was last revised and approved on January 19, 2017. All policies established by the Park and Recreation Board must comply with City Code, City Charter, and State Law. All Golf Pro contracts should reference this Policy.

Staff has revised the Golf Course Operations Policy to include the following updates and revisions:

- 1. Revised references to this document as an "Administrative Directive for Golf Course Operations" to read as "Golf Course Operations Policy".
- 2. Section A.3. added the City's right to close the golf course for public health safety precautions.
- 3. Section G.7. added the Pro Shop staff are not allowed to search golf bags, back packs, or purses for alcoholic beverages.
- 4. Section H.2. and H.3. removed both sections which referred to Senior Annual Cards and Private Cart Annual Cards, as both are no longer offered.
- 5. Section J.1. revised reference to "Assistant Director of Administration/Business Services" to read as "Park and Recreation Department Assistant Director" for simplicity and versatility.
- 6. Section L. revised and rearranged regulations in this section to emphasize the prohibition of alcohol and personal coolers brought onto golf course property; outlined the action necessary when alcohol and personal coolers are brought on property; and clarified the implications of violations and frequent offenders.

This action requests the Board to adopt the proposed Golf Course Operations Policy.
