
DOWNTOWN PARKS OVERVIEW

- Downtown Parks
 Master Plan Update
 (2013)
- Parks for Downtown
 Dallas (PDD)
 committed \$35M in
 matching funds for
 2017 Bond Program



DOWNTOWN PARKS OVERVIEW

- Four priority parks
 - Carpenter Park
 - Harwood Park
 - Pacific Plaza
 - West End Plaza
- Builds on existing downtown parks
 - Main Street Garden
 - Belo Garden
 - Klyde Warren Park
 - Dealey Plaza
 - Pioneer Plaza/Cemetery



CARPENTER PARK

- Design Development agreement with Carpenter Park LLC approved
 - Park and Recreation Board November 19, 2015
 - City Council December 9, 2015
- Final design will be presented to the Park and Recreation Board in August 2016
- Currently working on removing, reconfiguring and storing Robert Irwin's Portal Piece (Slice)
- Design Development phase (including Robert Irwin's fee) expected to cost \$930,000


CARPENTER PARK



HARWOOD PARK

- PDD owns 85% of site
- Ten Eyck Landscape Architects and Quimby/McCoy working on conceptual design
 - Will be presented to Park and Recreation Board in 2016
- Final design of park dependent on DART D2 alignment
- \$10M invested by PDD and the Decherd Foundation on land acquisitions
- Conceptual master plan: \$200,000
- Requires abandonment of Wood Street
- Great lawn for Harwood Park is larger than Main Street
 Garden


PACIFIC PLAZA

- Park and Recreation Department owns entire site
 - Land purchased in partnership with Trust for Public Land
- Park and Recreation Board review of project development
 - May 22, 2014
 - August 7, 2014
- PDD is convening a stakeholders meeting with landscape architecture firm SWA
- PDD will pay for schematic design and design development
 - \$550,000 estimated cost
- Schematic design estimated to be completed in late 2016
 - Park and Recreation Board will be briefed on plan
- Requires abandonment or temporary closure of Live Oak Street

PACIFIC PLAZA



- Site not presently owned by the City of Dallas
 - \$4.6M allocated in 2006 Bond Program for land acquisition for 617
 Corbin Site
 - PDD has committed to contributing additional funds for land acquisition costs
- .73 acre site
- PDD to pay for schematic development
- Site strongly favored by West End Business Association and Downtown Dallas Inc.
