Cedar Ridge Preserve Background

- Management
 - 2002: Established as Cedar Ridge Preserve, half owned by city, half leased from county
 - 2003: Dallas Park Board contracted with Dallas County Audubon Society, Inc. ("Audubon Dallas") for management
 - 2012: Latest 5-year contract signed
- Physical Characteristics
 - 600 Acres (0.94 sq mi)
 - Topology is an escarpment, with 180 foot elevation change
 - Mostly forest, some prairie
 - 10 miles of hiking trails
 - Roughly half of the area is untouched
 - Education building, rest rooms, flower gardens, amphitheater

"Above all the others, I like Cedar Ridge Preserve, an area near Joe Pool Lake that is managed by Audubon Dallas. The first time I hiked there, I carried my 2-year-old son Will in a backpack.
