
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**10-Minute Walk to a Park** NATIONAL CAMPAIGN

- National campaign to ensure everyone has safe, easy access to a quality park within a 10-minute walk of home
- 300+ mayors have joined effort
- Mayor Mike Rawlings joined in May 2017, and Mayor Eric Johnson reaffirmed the city's commitment in August 2019


# 1 MINUTE WALK

#### IMPROVING ACCESS TO PARKS + GREEN SPACES



How to expand access? SCHOOLYARDS

- In 2017, only 60% of Dallas residents had a park within a 10minute walk of home
- 513,961 people lacked park access
- Public school campuses offer ideal opportunity for partnership to expand park access without purchasing land



## Cool Schools Community Parks

- A key strategic direction in the department's strategic plan is developing new partnerships
- Partnership between Dallas Park & Recreation, DISD, RISD, Texas Trees
   Foundation, and The Trust for Public
   Land
- Allows residents to use schoolyards as park space after hours and weekends



## Cool Schools Community Parks

- Governed by inter-local agreement (ILA) that allows for public use of schoolyard, capital improvements, and shared maintenance
- 2017: ILA established between City of Dallas and school districts, covering 25 DISD campuses and 7 RISD campuses
- Campuses selected through a data-driven approach, prioritized locations with potential to increase park access for surrounding neighborhoods



# Timeline

#### 2020

- Amend existing ILA to replace 6 campuses and add 20 new campuses, bringing total number of eligible campuses to 52 (DISD & RISD)
- 6 Cool School
  Community Parks
  open to public
  (privately funded)

#### 2021 – 2022

- 15 Cool School
  Community Parks
  open to the public
- Secure funding for remaining 26 campuses

### **2023 – 2025**

 Develop final 26 Cool School Community Parks

# Next Steps

- Park design developed through participatory process with input from students, faculty, parents, and nearby residents
- Texas Trees implements their "Cool Schools" curriculum at each campus
- School and neighborhood invited to events, including tree plantings, "pop-up" park days, groundbreaking, and grand opening celebration
- "Campus Green Team" established to provide volunteer care of new park



# Funding

- Cost per campus is \$350,000
- Donor has committed \$6,300,000 over three years toward the program
- Project partners are actively seeking additional funding
