BACKGROUND

For years, the American National Red Cross, in conjunction with the Department of Emergency Management, have utilized Park and Recreation facilities as Emergency Shelters to house displaced citizens of Dallas, Dallas County and others as needed. This agreement was drafted to formally address the responsibilities of the American Red Cross and the Park and Recreation Department. In January 2008, the Park and Recreation Board and the City Council approved the original shelter usage agreement which did not have terms but rather a convenience clause. In 2014 the City and the American National Red Cross entered into a three-year agreement with no renewals. An official agreement has not been in place since 2017.

The proposed shelter agreement provides that in the event of a disaster and/or evacuation to Dallas, the City of Dallas Park and Recreation facilities may be used as shelter sites.

Proposed deal points:

- 1. The City will not charge the Red Cross a fee for use of the premises.
- 2. The Red Cross has primary responsibility for the operation of the shelter sites and will designate a Shelter Manager.
- 3. City will appoint a Facility Coordinator who will coordinate use of City facilities with the Red Cross Shelter Manager.

Authorize a three-year agreement with the American National Red Cross (Red Cross), the DallasChapter, to permit the temporary use of Park and Recreation facilities, as Red Cross public shelter during a declared or undeclared natural disaster or other condition or event requiring the activation of the disaster relief functions of the Red Cross - Financing: No cost consideration to the City- Page 2

- 4. The Shelter Manager and Facility Coordinator will conduct a pre-inspection survey of the shelter(s) before they are turned over to the Red Cross.
- 5. The City's Facility Coordinator will, on request and if feasible, appoint a Foodservice Manager and Facility Custodian. The Foodservice Manager will establish a feeding schedule and determine foodservice inventory and supply needs. The Facility Custodian will establish and direct the sanitation inventory and supply needs.
- 6. The Red Cross will pay or reimburse the City for all food and sanitation supplies as approved by the Shelter Manager and used in the course of operating the shelters.
- 7. The Red Cross will provide for safety and security inside of the shelters.
- 8. The Agreement is revocable upon 30 days' notice by either party. Upon termination, the Red Cross will vacate the premises and repair any damages, ordinary wear and tear excepted, caused by its occupancy at its sole expense.
- 9. The Red Cross will indemnify the City, its officers, its agents and employees.
- 10. The Red Cross shall carry insurance coverage in the amounts specified by the City in addition to City being named as additional insured on the Red Cross' General Liability Coverage.

BACKGROUND

This action will authorize exercise of a twelve-month extension of the agreement, which was executed on June 19, 2021, so that The Trust for Public Land (TPL) can undertake construction of Phase 1 of the project. If the extension is approved the agreement will terminate June 18, 2022.

On April 4, 2019, the Park Board authorized a two-year Development Agreement with TPL, with one twelve-month extension, subject to Park Board approval, for the development of Judge Charles R. Rose Community Park. TPL anticipates being ready to bid Phase 1 of the project in January 2022.

It was the intent of the parties to extend the contract this spring but due to unforeseen delays the parties did not meet this deadline. With TPL ready to bid the project this January, exercising the extension of the agreement at this time will allow TPL to move forward with bidding and construction of Phase 1.

After bids are received, and construction begins, staff and TPL will assess the anticipated construction schedule to determine if additional time is needed for TPL to complete the project. If construction is anticipated to extend beyond June 2022 the City will enter into a new development agreement with TPL, subject to Park Board and Council authorization.

TPL funded design of the project. TPL is also funding Phase 1 construction of the project with no cost consideration to the City.

Staff recommends approval of this extension of the agreement.





BACKGROUND

This action will authorize a liquidation of the Bid Bond for construction of Kidd Springs Park Japanese Garden Renovations by C. Green Scaping, LP and will result in revenue in an amount of \$46,629.40 which is 5% of the total contract (total amount of \$932,588.00).

On May 5, 2021 and May 12, 2021, the City of Dallas advertised for bids for Kidd Springs Park Japanese Garden renovations. The scope of work included the construction of an accessible walkway through the Japanese Garden between the recreation center and creative playground. In response to the advertisement, the Office of Procurement Services received bids from three responsive firms on June 18, 2021. Park & Recreation selected C. Green Scaping, LP, the lowest responsible bidder. This project was included in the 2017 Bond Program.

On October 21, 2021, C. Green Scaping, LP withdrew their bid due to their inability to find adequate workforce. The company contacted staff after the Park and Recreation Board had just approved the award indicating they were unable to fulfill their obligations. Consequently, they were deemed non-responsive, and therefore the City of Dallas will liquidate the Bid Bond.

PRIOR ACTION/REVIEW (COUNCIL, BOARDS, COMMISSIONS)

On October 21, 2021, the Park and Recreation Board approved a contract award to C. Green Scaping, LP.



Jurisdiction/Authorization

The Park and Recreation Board is a quasi-legislative Board established by the Dallas City Charter, Chapter XVII.

In 1905, revisions to the City of Dallas Charter created a Park and Recreation Department to be administered by the Park and Recreation Director under the supervision of the Park and Recreation Board. The Board has fifteen members, the number equal to the number of members on the City Council. Each City Council member and the Mayor appoint a person to the Park Board. The Mayor appoints the Park Board President from among the confirmed Park Board members, subject to ratification by a majority of the City Council. The Park and Recreation Board members have jurisdiction over the control, management and maintenance of the public parks of the city, with power to acquire, in the name of the city, land for park purposes.



 that allows teens the opportunity to explore Dallas venues and attractions at no cost to teens. There were 5,587
 passes redeemed.
- Implemented Adventure Camp at Samuell Farm a new, 9-week specialty summer camp providing outdoor adventure experiences such as mountain biking, kayaking, archery, fishing and survival skills for 229 youth ages 7-15 years old
- Completed the 2021 Teach a Child to Swim fundraising campaign raising \$32,796 and awarding 163 scholarships valued at \$6,750. Awarded an additional \$6470 in scholarships to 156 individuals through the Kidd Springs Brick Paver Donor program.
- Certified 185 lifeguards, 18 water safety instructors, 20 lifeguard instructor renewals, and 11 water fitness instructors
