This was a virtual meeting held via Cisco Webex. The public were able to view the Open Session meeting on Channel 96 or on the internet.

President Collins called the meeting to order at 11:03 a.m.

Agenda Item 1. Speakers – The following people registered to speak. Some of the speakers might no longer have been available or connected when it was their turn to speak.

Vicky Taylor spoke about the Lake Highlands Public Improvement District and the Pegasus art work at watercrest park.

Gunnar Rawlings spoke about Crockett Park and dog parks.

Agenda Item 2. A motion by Fonya Mondell seconded by Daniel Wood, to approve the minutes of the January 28, 2021 Park and Recreation Board meeting, was carried. The vote was unanimous.

<u>UPDATES</u>

Director John Jenkins spoke about the current situation with COVID-19 and updated the Board:

Crystal Ross, Assistant Director provided the board some basic information about some of the Recreation Centers in Dallas becoming 'registration sites' for the Dallas County Health Department to register folks to receive the COVID-19 Vaccine. Ms. Ross stated she would send the Board a list of those Recreation Centers that were serving as registration hubs.

CONSENT AGENDA (ITEMS 3 - 8)

President Collins pulled item number 5 from consent due to Mr. Toynes having a conflict of interest. Fonya Mondell noted that the council district for Item 6 is incorrect and should be district 2. Therefore, a motion by Robb Stewart, seconded by Arun Agarwal to approve items 3, 4, 6-8 (with the district change on Item 6) was carried by unanimous vote.

<u>Agenda Item 3</u>. Judge Charles R. Rose Community Park (8) – A motion by Robb Stewart, seconded by Arun Agarwal, to authorize adoption of the Judge Charles R. Rose Community Park Master Plan – Financing: No cost consideration to the City (**Board briefed on January 28, 2021**), was carried by unanimous vote.

Agenda Item 4. Dallas Arboretum (9) – A motion by Robb Stewart, seconded by Arun Agarwal, to authorize Supplemental Agreement No.3 to the professional services contract with GSR Andrade Architects, Inc. for construction document, bidding assistance and providing construction administration services for adding public restrooms in the old caretaker quarters at the Dallas Arboretum located at 8525 Garland Road - Not to exceed \$75,235.00, from \$286,465.00 to \$361,700.00 - Financing: Park and Recreation Facilities (B) Fund (2017 General Obligation Bond Fund), was carried by unanimous vote.

Agenda Item 5. Woody Branch Creek (4) – A motion by Daniel Wood, seconded by Maria Hasbany to authorize acquisition from The Trust for Public Land of approximately 3,564,169 square feet (81.82 acres) of land located at 4900 South RL Thornton Freeway for development of a future park—Not to exceed \$2,510,000 (\$2,490,000 plus closing costs and title expenses not to exceed \$20,000)—Financing: Reforestation Fund, was carried by majority vote. (Toynes recused himself)

Agenda Item 6. Crockett Park (6 2) – A motion by Robb Stewart, seconded by Arun Agarwal, to authorize a construction services contract for the construction of the Crockett Park Dog Park – Site Development Project located at 501 Carroll Avenue – A S Con, Inc., lowest responsible bidder of five – Not to exceed \$531,150.00 – Financing: Neighborhood Parks Fund (2003 Bond Funds) (\$37,575.14), Neighborhood & Community Park Playground Recreation Fund (2003 Bond Funds) (\$12,424.86) and Park and Recreation Facilities Fund (2006 Bond Funds) (\$481,150.00), was carried by unanimous vote.

<u>Agenda Item 7.</u> Hillcrest Village Green Park (12) – A motion by Robb Stewart, seconded by Arun Agarwal, to authorize a dedication plaque for the Hillcrest Village Green park, located at 6959 Arapaho Road – Financing: No cost consideration to the City, was carried by unanimous vote.

Agenda Item 8. Watercrest Park (10) – A motion by Robb Stewart, seconded by Arun Agarwal, to authorize site for a new public artwork at Watercrest Park located at 7070 Skillman Road – Financing: No cost consideration to the City (**deferred from December 10, 2020**, was carried by unanimous vote.
