ADMINISTRATION AND FINANCE COMMITTEE

Vice President Stewart moved to remove items 7, 8, and 14 for Individual Consideration and approve the remaining items on Consent. Motion seconded by Lorena Tule-Romain and was approved by unanimous vote.

Agenda Item 3. Reverchon Park (2) – A motion by Robb Stewart, seconded by Lorena Tule-Romain, to authorize issuing an alcohol permit to Caroline Snabes, to serve alcohol at the Rise and Shine run event to be held at Reverchon Park, located at 3505 Maple Avenue. The event will be held on Sunday, April 26, 2020 from 11:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. – Estimated Revenue: \$250 (This is a recurring item), was carried by unanimous vote.

Agenda Item 4. Kiest Park (5) – A motion by Robb Stewart, seconded by Lorena Tule-Romain, to authorize issuing an alcohol permit to Scott Callahan, to serve alcohol at the Dallas Easter Classic tournament to be held at Kiest Park Softball Complex, located at 3080 South Hampton Road. The tournament will be held on Saturday, April 11, 2020 from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. and Sunday, April 12, 2020 from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. – Estimated Revenue: \$250 (This is a recurring item)

Fair Oaks Park (10) – A motion by Robb Stewart, seconded by Lorena Tule-Romain, to authorize the waiver of monthly court fees paid to the City of Dallas and provide a monthly stipend of \$1,500 to Rains Tennis Works, Inc., for the management and operation of Fair Oaks Tennis Center located at 7501 Merriman Parkway, for a period not to exceed six (6) months – Financing: \$9,000 General Fund, Estimated Revenue Loss: \$10,500, was carried by unanimous vote.

Agenda Item 7. Fair Park (7) - A motion by Barbara Barbee, seconded by Harrison Blair, to authorize the item with the following changes: Recommend that deal points for a twelve (12) month funding agreement with Texas Discovery Gardens in the amount of \$145,862 for programming and services, including community outreach services, horticulture information services and presentations at community centers and special facilities for the period of January 1, 2020 through December 31, 2020 be approved. Fair Park First to receive and immediately disperse those funds to Texas Discovery Garden for the

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payment of a twelve (12) month funding agreement in the amount of \$145,862 to provide services and programs within the City of Dallas for the period of January 1, 2020 through December 31, 2020 – total not to exceed \$145,862 – Financing: Current Funds, was carried by unanimous vote.

Fee increase (2) - A motion by Robb Stewart, seconded by Lorena Tule-Romain, to authorize Shakespeare Dallas, at Samuell-Grand Park Amphitheater located at 1500 Tenison Parkway, to increase the admission rate to \$20 for Thursday through Sunday performances, effective upon approval by the Park and Recreation Board - Financing: No cost consideration to the City, was carried by unanimous vote.
