WHEREAS, on May 25, 2016, a contract was awarded to Phoenix I Restoration and Construction, Ltd. for renovations at Bachman Recreation Center located at 2750 Bachman Drive, in an amount not to exceed \$576,240.00; and

WHEREAS, on November 10, 2016, Administrative Action No. 16-0946 authorized Change Order No. 1 to the contract with Phoenix I Restoration and Construction, Ltd. for modifications of roof perimeter, deletion of drain bowl installation and removal of foour trees and wood decl repair at Bachman Recreation Center, in an amount not to exceed \$34,099.44, increasing the contract amount from \$576,240.00 to \$610,339.44; and

WHEREAS, on January 24, 2017, Administrative Action No. 17-0149 authorized Change Order No. 2 to the contract with Phoenix I Restoration and Construction, Ltd. for a decrease in the contract to include a credit for omitted sealant at exterior joints between wall system and foundation, metal roof deck, removal of one roof drain; and other miscellaneous costs at Bachman Recreation Center, in an amount not to exceed (\$4,081.76), decreasing the contract amount from \$610,339.44 to \$606,257.68; and

WHEREAS, this action will authorize Change Order No. 3 to the contract with Phoenix I Restoration and Construction, Ltd., in an amount not to exceed \$113,762.53, increasing the contract from \$606,257.68 to \$720,020.21 for the replacement of flooring on pool deck and locker/shower areas at Bachman Recreation Center.

Now, Therefore,

While the Park and Recreation Board is hereby recommending which projects/parks are considered as Citywide, a project designated as Citywide is able to be included for bond program funding either in the Citywide or Council District category.

Park Classifications:

The Dallas Park and Recreation Department park classifications are based on the National Recreation and Park Association's (NRPA) park classification system. The Park and Recreation Board recommends to the City Council that the NRPA Park Classification System continue to be utilized for Dallas parks.

This system classifies parks as follows:

Mini Park

The mini park is used to address limited, isolated, or unique recreation needs of concentrated populations. Mini parks typically serve a quarter-mile radius. The size of a mini-park ranges between 2,500 square feet and one acre in size. These parks may be either active or passive, but address a specific recreational need rather than a particular population density, although a high population density may create a specific recreation need. Recommended improvements for mini parks may include a small pavilion, picnic area, park benches, and a 6 foot-wide perimeter trail. Off-street parking is not recommended.

BACKGROUND (Continued)

Neighborhood Park

Neighborhood parks serve a variety of age groups within a limited area or neighborhood. They range in size from 1 to 15 acres and generally serve residents within a quarter- to half-mile radius. The neighborhood park includes areas for active recreation activities such as field games, court games, playgrounds, etc. Passive recreation activities may include walking, viewing, sitting, and picnicking. Facilities are generally unlighted and off-street parking is not recommended.

Community Park

Community parks are larger than neighborhood parks and serve several neighborhoods. They range in size from 16 to 99 acres and generally serve a user area of one to two miles in radius. The community park may include areas for intense recreation activities such as competitive sports, swimming, tennis, playgrounds, volleyball, etc. There may also be passive recreation opportunities such as walking, viewing, sitting, and picnicking.

Metropolitan Park

Metropolitan parks are large park facilities that serve multiple communities. They range in size from 100 to 499 acres and serve the entire city. The metropolitan park includes natural areas or developed areas for a variety of outdoor recreation activities such as ball fields, playgrounds, boating, fishing, swimming, picnicking, and trail systems.

Regional Park

Regional parks are very large multi-use parks that serve several communities within a particular region. They are 500 acres or larger in size and serve those areas within a one-hour driving distance. The regional park provides both active and passive recreation opportunities, with a wide selection of facilities for all age groups. They may also include areas of nature preservation for activities such as sightseeing, nature study area, wildlife habitat, and conservation. National Recreation and Park Association (NRPA) standards for regional parks vary due to the specific site characteristics and natural resources.

Special Use Area

Special use areas and parks are for specialized or single-purpose recreation activities. NRPA defines these parks as historical areas, nature centers, marinas, golf courses, zoos, conservatories, arboretums, arenas, amphitheaters, plazas, or community squares. There are no specific standards for size or acreage since each site will vary. Special use parks may carry a double classification.

Linear Park / Linkages

Linear parks and linkages are built connections or natural corridors that link parks together. Typically, the linear park is developed for one or more modes of recreational travels such as walking, jogging, biking, in-line skating, hiking, horseback riding, and canoeing. Linear parks may include active play areas. The NRPA does not stipulate specific standards for linear parks other than they should be sufficient to protect the resource and provide maximum usage.

BACKGROUND (Continued)

Conservancy

Conservancies include areas for protection and management of the natural / cultural environment with recreation use as a secondary objective. Recreation use might include passive recreation such as viewing and studying nature and wildlife habitat. The NRPA does not indicate specific acreage or size standards for the conservancy other than they should be sufficient to protect the resource and provide appropriate usage.

Signature Parks:

The Dallas Park and Recreation Department's 2002 *Renaissance Plan* recommended that certain parks be designated as "Signature". Signature Parks are high profile components of the Dallas park system that give a distinct identity to the city and the North Texas region. The Park and Recreation Board recommends that the Signature Park designation continue to be utilized and that Signature Parks be considered Citywide. The Park and Recreation Board recommends that two parks be added to the list of existing Signature Parks: 1) Bachman Lake Park and 2) Samuell Grand Park.

The following list is recommended for Signature Park designation:

- o Bachman Lake Park (added)
- o Crawford Memorial Park
- Dallas Arboretum
- o Dallas Zoo
- o Downtown Parks, including Klyde Warren (system)
- o Fair Park
- o Kiest Park
- o Samuell Grand Park (added)
- o Turtle Creek Greenbelt Park
- o White Rock Lake Park

Citywide Parks/Projects:

The Park and Recreation Board recommends to the City council that the following types of parks be considered as Citywide for future Park General Obligation Bond Propositions:

- Parks which are classified Metro or Regional, as determined by their acreage, are considered as Citywide Projects
- Some parks classified as Special Use Areas, Linear Park/Linkages and Conservancies are also considered Citywide if they serve the entire city, region or multiple Council Districts
- Signature Parks
- Linear Trails that are a part of the Trail network
- Recreation Centers
- Family Aquatic Centers, Community Pools, and Spraygrounds
- Maintenance and Service Centers
- Reservation Facilities

- Citywide allowances for projects such as Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), environmental conservation, toilets, code, etc.
- Large Dog Parks
- Future parks shall be considered for Citywide and/or Signature Park designation once developed

SUBJECT

Authorize i) approval of the terms for the Development Agreement between the Pacific Plaza LLC ("Pacific LLC") and Parks for Downtown Dallas ("PfDD Foundation") collectively the "Developer" and the City for the design and construction of a public park currently named Pacific Plaza; ii) approval of an Operating Endowment Agreement between the City and Developer; and iii) recommendation to City Council for approval of both the Development and Operating Endowment Agreements, as approved as to form by the City Attorney's Office - Financing: No cost consideration to the City

BACKGROUND

Pacific Plaza was identified as one of three proposed core park sites in the 2004 Downtown Parks Master Plan, which was adopted by the Park and Recreation Board and City Council in 2004. Five tracts of land, totaling 3.2 acres, were purchased in partnership with the Trust for Public Land ("TPL") between 2005 and 2008 for \$9.1M. The land is currently used as a surface parking lot with approximately 300 spaces leased to the Parking Company of America. This lease can be terminated without cause prior to the commencement of construction.

In 2013, the Park and Recreation Department updated the 2004 Downtown Parks Master Plan (with funding provided by The Belo Foundation and Maureen H. and Robert W. Decherd) and again identified Pacific Plaza as one of four priority parks to be developed for the citizens of Dallas. The Belo Foundation, which funded the development of Belo Garden in 2012, and the schematic and design development plan for Carpenter Plaza in 2015, was renamed Parks for Downtown Dallas (PfDD) in October 2015. Parks for Downtown Dallas has also funded the conceptual plan for the proposed Harwood Park in 2016.

For Pacific Plaza, Developer funded schematic design and the Live Oak Street closure traffic study at a cost of \$476,000. Schematic design was undertaken by SWA, landscape architects, between March and October 2016, incorporating input from three public input meetings (two held on March 29, and one on September 22). The Park and Recreation Board approved the schematic design agreement with Developer on June 2, 2016, and a final schematic plan was provided to the Park and Recreation Department in October 2016.

BACKGROUND (continued)

On December 7, 2016, the Developer offered to fund the construction of Pacific Plaza without any financial contribution from the City of Dallas, from a future bond program. On December 15, 2016 Park and Recreation Board unanimously authorized staff to enter into final negotiations withthe Developer for a development agreement and an endowment agreement to provide supplemental funding for the annual operation and maintenance of Pacific Plaza.

This agenda item action will authorize a development agreement with the Developer for the design and development of the proposed Pacific Plaza and an operation endowment agreement. This 3.2 acre park will enhance the quality of life for those who live, work, and visit downtown Dallas. The establishment of this park, in association with other downtown parks, will help stimulate economic development in the downtown area.

PROPOSED DEAL POINTS FOR THE DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT

- Developer will fund improvements up to \$15 million
- Developer will manage the design and construction of improvements at Pacific Plaza and will be subject to the City Representative's (Park and Recreation Department Director) review and approval.
- Development agreement commences on execution and terminates one year after completion of construction and issuance of final acceptance letter from the City
- Required environmental clean-up of site, if needed, shall be the responsibility of the City, with an amount not to exceed \$2M.
- Any contracts entered into by the Developer under agreements for design or construction of the park shall 1) contain insurance provisions with limits acceptable to the City, 2) release, indemnify and hold the City harmless, 3) obligate the contractor or firm to comply with all applicable state, federal, and local laws, and 4) comply with the City's Business Inclusion and Development Plan (BID Plan) to facilitate M/WBE participation.
- City representative will review and approve design development and construction documents, and the City representative has right to inspect construction.
- After completion of construction and acceptance by the City representative, Pacific Plaza will be turned over to the City for maintenance and operation.
- There is no connection to, or contingency based upon future bond program match funding.
- There is a proposed separate Operating Endowment Agreement that addresses the establishment by the Developer of a \$1M permanent endowment fund for Pacific Plaza.
- Naming Rights (included in the separate Operating Endowment Agreement, also):
 - Developer reserves the right to name the Park if name is other than Pacific Plaza, subject to the approval of the Park and Recreation Board
 - Developer is authorized to solicit contributions from donors for naming rights

PROPOSED DEAL POINTS FOR THE DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT (continued)

- If another donor provides a minimum of \$10M, unless a different amount is agreed between the parties, to name the Park. Park name will be subject to Developer and Park and Recreation Board approvals
- Components of the Park can be named subject to Developer and Park and Recreation Board approvals
- Naming rights proceeds, if raised, will be used only for Downtown Parks first for construction of the four new priority parks (Pacific Plaza, Carpenter Plaza, Harwood Park and West End Plaza) and then for permanent endowments benefiting new or existing Downtown parks

PROPOSED DEAL POINTS FOR THE OPERATING ENDOWMENT AGREEMENT

- Developer will deposit \$1M in a separate account upon execution of the Agreement
- Funds will be maintained by the Developer
- On an annual basis, 4.5% of the fund as of December 31 will be disbursed to the City on October 1 of the following year once Park has been declared complete by Developer and the City
- The 4.5% distribution may be used to offset expenses related to the day-to-day operations and maintenance of Pacific Plaza
- The duration of the Operating Endowment Agreement commence on execution and will terminate when all funds in the operating endowment account are expended

PRIOR ACTION/REVIEW (COUNCIL, BOARDS, COMMISSIONS)

The Park and Recreation Board was briefed on the development status of Pacific Plaza on December 5, 2013, May 22, 2014, and August 7, 2014.

The Park and Recreation Board was briefed on February 18 and October 20, 2016 on Downtown Parks, including Pacific Plaza.

The Park and Recreation Board approved the schematic design agreement on June 2, 2016.

On December 15, 2016 Park and Recreation Board unanimously authorized staff to enter into final negotiations with Developerfor 1) a Development Agreement and 2) an Operating Endowment agreement to offset funding for the annual operation and maintenance of Pacific Plaza.

The Park and Recreation Board was briefed on February 16, 2017 on the proposed deal points for the Development Agreement and Operating Endowment Agreement.

FISCAL INFORMATION

This action has no cost consideration to the City. Pacific LLC will provide 100% funding to develop Pacific Plaza

Dear President Wells and Mr. Winters,

Responding to your suggestion that Parks for Downtown Dallas (PfDD) take on the responsibility for funding construction of Pacific Plaza without any financial contribution by the Park Department through the 2017 bond program caused us to think about the funding and sequencing of all four priority parks recommended in the 2013 Update of the Downtown Parks Master Plan. We have refined our response as described below.

The ultimate effect of PfDD funding Pacific Plaza outright is to remove that park from deliberations about what is included, or not, in the 2017 bond program. In practical terms, the scenario we described in our November 30, 2016 letter to you allocates \$25.6 million of PfDD's overall commitment of \$44.6 million to the following: \$10 million in cash for Carpenter Park, \$10.6 million in land for Harwood Park, and \$5 million in cash for West End Plaza. While construction of these three priority parks remains directly dependent on the inclusion of \$35 million in matching funds in the 2017 bond program, construction of Pacific Plaza would not be.

PfDD is modifying its November 30 proposal with respect to Pacific Plaza as follows:

- Following the timely completion of a mutually-acceptable development agreement between the Park Department and Parks for Downtown Dallas, PfDD will complete design development, then construct Pacific Plaza using currently available resources held by PfDD. This means that the Pacific Plaza project can commence immediately and be completed within approximately 24 months from the execution of the development agreement. There is no longer any connection to, or contingency based upon, the 2017 bond program.
- PfDD will establish a \$1 million permanent operating endowment for Pacific Plaza in a separate, discreet account within PfDD's existing financial structure. This is a new commitment by PfDD. Income from this permanent endowment will be available to help fund the annual operation and maintenance of Pacific Plaza. PfDD will commit to establish this fund as part of the Pacific Plaza development agreement.
- PfDD will help raise other monies from the private sector which will enable PfDD to establish a second permanent endowment for Pacific Plaza to fund long-term capital improvements and capital repairs for the park as needed. This will be addressed outside the development agreement and is not a requirement of commencing construction of Pacific Plaza.

As noted in our November 30 letter, Pacific Plaza is ripe to be built. We believe that building a park of this quality in the true center of Downtown will not only further lift property valuations and tax revenues, but the process itself can be a catalyst for significant new investment throughout Downtown.

We hope that this revised proposal simplifies the Park Board's deliberation with respect to authorizing Mr. Winters to proceed with negotiating a development agreement with PfDD regarding Pacific Plaza, using the SWA schematic design recently completed on behalf the Park Department.

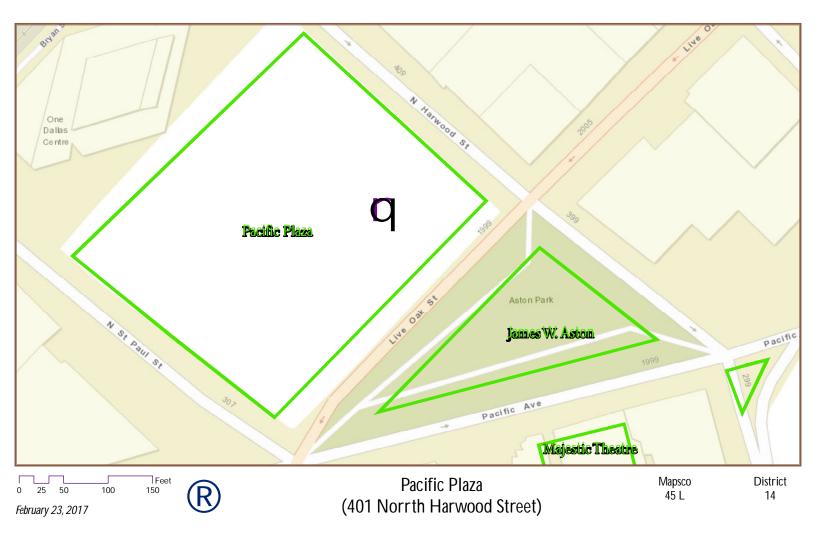
